Encounter with the Risen Lord

We hear this weekend of another encounter the apostles have with the Risen Lord. Each encounter with the resurrected Lord expresses at its core the fact that Christ still lives; He has conquered death. This victory is in union with our human nature. Jesus did not reject his human body once risen from the dead, but remains united with it, as evident through his physical encounters with his disciples. He is not simply a pure spirit as if to imply the body is bad and needs to be removed to come to a higher

state of being. Rather, His resurrected body teaches us the dignity of each human body and our need to respect the body at all times, living and deceased.

Our faith teaches that every living person, born and unborn, deserves our respect. Pope Francis wrote that each life "is always sacred and demands love for each person, regardless of his or her stage of development." This respect for the body is also to be given to those who have died. For in death, the Christian's participation in the life of the Trinity is not ended but transformed through the Easter joy of the resurrection.

The human person, body and soul, created in the image and likeness of God, has always been held in the highest esteem by the Church, including in death. This is the body washed in baptism, anointed with the oil of salvation, and fed with the Eucharist. This is the body whose feet walked the path of faith, whose hands embraced others in love, whose heart beat with compassion for the poor and sorrowing. In the body, a person expresses one's identity and self-consciousness, soul and spirit. The resurrection of the Lord (Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity) is what we anticipate as our reward for faithful discipleship, for we profess in the Creed, "I look forward to the resurrection of the dead."

In light of the resurrection, it is understandable that the Church insists on the sacredness of the human body in death as in life. This reverence and respect in which the body is to be treated is affirmed in the funeral rites of the Church and why the Catholic teaching clearly stresses the preference for burial or entombment of the body (or cremated remains) in a cemetery or mausoleum. This place of final disposition serves as a place of remembrance, prayer, and mourning,



Happy Easter! The party is not over yet!

Easter liturgies are always so refreshing! There is just something about the candles, the music, and even the spring air that breathes life anew. For over forty days (if you exclude Sundays), we had been wandering around in the desert, and then we found The Living Water. But did you find an oasis or something more?

Easter is not a weekend or a patch of fertile land in the middle of your desert. We observe Lent for 40 days, and the festivities of Easter and Pentecost last 50! The celebration outshines the hardships of Lent. The celebration goes beyond the time of preparation.

I enjoy cooking, and most family celebrations include a meal. Sometimes those meals can take days to prepare. At the end of the meal, I have found myself looking around, knowing the time for clean-up was at hand, thinking, 'that's it? all the prep, all the work, and it's over already!' Then dishes start, and life goes on. Often my Easter celebration follows a similar path.

Throughout Lent, I have been preparing and working toward this event. Easter Sunday comes, then Monday and life goes back to normal. But that is not how we are called to live this season.

Living Easter liturgically throws fuel on my desire for heaven! We live this life on earth, and it is downright hard at times. There is no sugar coating it. Life is not easy. We find joy and see God at work, but ultimately, our time on earth is a journey towards eternity, towards heaven. Much like Lent, this journey is full of hardships. But at the end of this journey, if we strive toward God and live out our call to virtue, our reward is eternal. The Easter season overshadows the hardship of Lent, and Eternity in heaven will more than surpass our difficulties on earth!

Think of the joy you experience when you taste that first bite of chocolate or ice cream after denying yourself for so long. It's something so little and trivial, but at that moment, it's a small taste of heaven.

We are called to a life of sacrifice as Christians. It's not easy, and scripture tells us if we do it correctly, we will be hated. But heaven is worth it! Continue on in your Easter celebration. Let the party outshine the difficulties of Lent as a reminder that we are made for eternity. In the words of St. Therese of Lisieux, "The world's thy ship and not thy home!"

Happy Easter! Let us move together towards that eternal Easter celebration in heaven!
