The Deep Love of the Trinity

I share with each of you an article that the Director of Spiritual Direction Formation at the Institute of Priestly Formation sent to me.

The Easter readings are full of accounts of the deep love of the Trinity for us! Have you noticed how Jesus takes the initiative in the Resurrection narratives: He enters through the locked doors where the apostles are huddled in fear and dismay; He joins the disciples on the road to Emmaus to reveal His saving love in word and in the breaking of the bread; He harkens the disciples to cast the net to the other side to bring in a vast catch of fish. If we listen attentively, we can see Jesus' love coming into those places where His disciples most needed Him: in fear, guilt, sorrow, fatigue, and uncertainty about the future. He comes to bring the power of His Cross and Resurrection with its new life and new hope; through this, He missions them to go forth and proclaim His saving love to the whole world.

How deeply our hearts and all of us throughout the world need to receive this Love and Life, not only in all the external stresses of our days, but also in the stresses within our own hearts. The temptations of the enemy assault this unconditional and everlasting Love to try to convince us otherwise.

As we become more aware, we can hear lies with which the enemy taunts us: to think that we are inadequate, that God is disappointed with us, that we should stay stuck in shame at the sin of our lives, that it is right to carry guilt at all our past weaknesses and mistakes. The enemy also wants us to believe that we are alone, that God cannot provide all we need for the future, and that it all depends on us. Fr. Stinissen proposes that a main cause of our weariness is: "We have not surrendered our past with its guilt and painful wounds. We carry it with us like a heavy burden. Nor do we dare to surrender our future to God. We are afraid that He will take advantage of our trust" (Into Your Hands, Father, p. 62).

Jesus comes to each of us where He knows we most need Him. And He continued on page 3

asks us to choose to surrender into His love. He asks us to accept His mercy and to receive His gaze of love. But we have a choice: to claim this Love and Truth or to hold onto the lies that are not from God. He asks for our Yes to receive His love.

This week as you pray you might consider the following:

- 1. Pause before you begin to pray. Think about how Jesus is already taking the initiative and coming to you with love right where you need Him most.
- 2. Ask Him for the grace to give Him anything you are holding on to, and to say yes to receive the fullness of His love.
- 3. Remember, Jesus loves you unconditionally. He has died for you, and He will never abandon you and all those you love. Let us, like the Virgin Mary, say, "Yes" to Him to receive this life-giving Love.





Lessons from Fatima

On May 13, we honor our Lady of Fatima. One of my favorite Marian apparitions, as there are so many beautiful lessons, Fatima can teach us. First, the Angel of Peace came to the children before Mary's apparitions. The angel came to teach the children how to pray and offer sacrifices to God. I often reflect on Mary visiting these humble little country children that lived a very simple life. And yet, they were called to more. The angel taught them how to pray and how to receive Communion. On one occasion, the Angel of Peace prostrated himself before the Consecrated Host. Here is an angel of God humbling himself dramatically before the Eucharist, the same Eucharist I receive every time I go to Mass.

An interesting aspect is that the Angel of Peace had to take a Consecrated Host from a church. Even God does not break His own rules. The angels recognize what only a priest in the context of Mass can do and who is truly present in the Eucharist. And I can receive this wonderful gift daily! Sometimes, I like to think about the Angel of Peace as I walk up to receive God - Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity in the Eucharist.

St. Maximilian Kolbe said, "if angels could be jealous of men, they would be so for one reason: Holy Communion." That is a powerful thought, especially thinking about the Angel of Peace laying prostrate, teaching these young children how to receive this most precious gift from God!

Blessed Francisco is one of my favorites. The three Fatima children each received different blessings. Lucia, the eldest of the three children, could see, hear, and talk to the Blessed Mother. Jacinta, her cousin, was able to see and hear Mary. Francisco, Jacinta's brother, was only able to see Mary. I often think of Francisco and how he took this special gift and never compared it to that of his sister and cousin. Francisco received a special gift regardless of what the others received. He was humble and accepted what God gave him with gratitude.

The Blessed Mother also told Francisco that he would go to Hell if he did not change his ways and repent. He listened. He made daily sacrifices for the rest of his short life and offered prayers for souls separated from God. Lucia, Jacinta, and Francisco were good children. They listened to their parents, prayed the Rosary, and yet Francisco's soul was in danger. It makes me stop and think, am I too apathetic about the state of my own soul? Would Mary give me the same warning?

Our Lady of Fatima, pray for us! Blessed Francisco, pray for us!
