It's the Same Spirit!

Recently a friend in ministry posted on social media that she was tired of hearing, 'thoughts and prayers.' It's a sentiment that has been shared a lot over the past couple of weeks. While I can understand where she was coming from, it broke my heart to hear a devout Catholic say that prayer is just an empty slogan.

I am not going to talk about the tragedy or the response. Not to be callous, but this happens with every tragedy, and responses are often political and divisive. What breaks my heart beyond this tragedy is that so many Christians don't see God as an answer, let alone the answer. Have we lost faith? Do we no longer believe that God hears our prayers or that they make a difference? Have we reached a point where our hope lies only in men?

A couple of years ago, I asked to pray for a woman in my community actively seeking an abortion. Drawing from Scripture, I thought we needed to gather in community, call down the Holy Spirit, and storm the heavens. We prayed for this woman, her unborn baby, the people at the crisis pregnancy center, the people at the abortion clinic, and anyone who could touch this woman and help her change her mind. I left the church that night so filled with hope. We came together. We prayed. We trusted God to hear us and answer our prayers. The next day, the woman went through with the abortion.

What does faith really mean? The Scripture, the Catechism, or the saints can give us a definition and powerful examples. But it doesn't seem to matter when you find out about the latest tragedy on the news or that the woman you had been so intently praying for went through with the abortion.

And this is the point in the story where I am supposed to give you the answer, the encouragement. But when I get right down to it, my faith, my belief, is built on faith.

"Lord, send out Your Spirit, and renew the face of the Earth." In creation, the Spirit of God was moving over the waters (Gen 1:2). The Spirit descended like a dove at the Baptism of the Lord (Mt 3:16). The Spirit came like a rush of a mighty wind at Pentecost (Acts 2:2). That same Spirit is active today and is active in your life!

I choose this foundation for my faith. I choose to believe that God is active in my life and that **He is the answer. I choose to put my faith in God**, not men. And that is why 'thoughts and prayers' is not an empty slogan. It is calling on that same Spirit to move in the heart of men, knowing nothing is possible, without God.
