A Grateful Response

How many times have we done something out of a sense of duty? Or no one steps up, and someone has to do it, so I guess I will. There is that reluctance. The definition of stewardship, however, says grateful response.

This year the parish festival fell on a sweltering weekend! As we began to clean up, a group of young, energetic boys was playing. They had the energy, and I was running low. So I asked them to empty the water coolers. They were so excited, working together to carry the heavy coolers full of ice to the curb to dump them. This, of course, was followed by a quick ice fight. But why not? It was hot!

The best was when I asked them to line up all the trash carts against the baseball field fence. The boys dispersed, and eight trash carts soon made their way down Quentin. All one could see were these trash carts slowly coming into a line as they neared the sidewalk ramp on the corner of Quentin and Douglas. Too short to see over the top of the bins, the boys continued their slow parade on the sidewalk to neatly park the carts. Their joy at being able to help was contagious.

Those boys were learning the stewardship way of life. This way of life is taught and passed down from generation to generation. Too often, what starts as a grateful response becomes a duty one must fulfill. We forget the gift and only see the task list.

Those young boys were a great reminder. They had the gift of energy, young muscles, of life given by God! That gift was one they wanted to share joyfully.

So many stewards came out and helped make the parish festival possible—so many parishioners gave something so that we could celebrate together. The stewardship way of life is the way of life at Blessed Sacrament. But let us continue to strive for a way of life that goes beyond duty to one that is a grateful response. That recognizes *everything we have; life itself is a gift from God. What is our response?*
