Homily



I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible.

He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end.


New Collection Boxes

St. Vincent de Paul Food Shelf Update



The St. Vincent de Paul food shelf was blessed with several grants to provide food during the COVID-19 pandemic. Our food shelf visits have greatly increased because of COVID-19, so the money was needed. The CARES grant provided \$9500 specifically for perishable food, The Food Group's grant of over \$6000 covered perishable and nonperishable food,

household items and personal care items. Additionally, a commercial \$4850 freezer was purchased with the Minnesota COVID Food Fund grant. We are no longer receiving grant money, but our many visitors still come to the food shelf. All donations are welcome, either monetary or nonperishable items for the food shelf. We particularly need spaghetti sauce, low salt cream of chicken and cream of mushroom soup, baked beans, mandarin oranges, pineapple. laundry soap, dish soap and paper bags with handles. The many thanks we receive from our visitors should really go to our parishioners for so generously supporting us.


Here's how it works:






