Dropped Host

Question: What happens to a consecrated host if it accidentally falls to the ground?

Answer: This a very practical question because, as we all know, accidents happen, even during the most careful celebration of the liturgy. The short answer to this question is that nothing happens to the consecrated host. The Real Presence of Jesus remains in the consecrated host or any consecrated wine that might accidentally be spilled.

Another question we might ask is: How should the minsters respond if the Eucharist is dropped or spilled? If this happens, the priest, deacon, or extraordinary minister of holy Communion should immediately pick up the dropped host and consume it. If it is a case of the Precious Blood being spilled, the minister would use the purificator (and additional purificators if needed) to clean the spill and then the area should be reverently washed as soon as the Mass is over and the water poured into the sacrarium (a special sink that is located in church sacristies for reverently disposing of holy water, the water used to clean sacred vessels, etc.).

Visiting our Home-bounds Even though we are still not completely relieved of the pandemic, it is good to know that people are getting vaccinated we are trying to connect with our homebound parishioners. Please call Fr. Jimmy (749 2720) or the parish office (632 6930) if you want to receive the Eucharist. Often the Church and our priests are unaware of who is in need of these visits.

If anyone who is willing to spend some time bringing the Holy Eucharist to our brothers and sisters who are sick and suffering or homebound, please let us know. So that we can assist our priests in reaching those who are unable to come to our church services.

Due to privacy laws health care facilities are not able to share this information. With everything being closed for over a year we need to update our lists of who would like Holy Eucharist and/or a Faith visit. If you have a family member or a neighbor that you think might be in need of a visit or Communion please call us and we will reach out to them and see if there is interest.

THE EPIPHANY OF THE LORD

We know there is still darkness in the world, but the light has come, and the light is in us. The New Year is waiting for us with so many blessings even in the midst of covid pandemic. It is a long standing custom on Epiphany to bless Chalk to be used to mark the homes of the faithful, asking God's protection upon the home and on all who live and visit there. For the blessing, the chalk is used to mark the following symbols over the doorway of the home.

20+C+M+B+22

The letters have two meanings. They are the initials of the traditional names of the three Magi: Caspar, Melchior and Balthasar. They also abbreviate the Latin words for "Christus Mansionem Benedicat," that means, "may Christ bless this dwelling." The crosses represent the protection of the Precious Blood of Christ, whom we invoke, and the holiness of the three Magi sanctified by their adoration of the infant Jesus. You can use the following prayer when you mark the symbols over the doorway.

God of heaven and earth, you revealed your only-begotten Son to every nation by the guidance of a star. Bless this house and all who live in here. May all who come to our home this year rejoice to find Christ living among us. Fill us with the light of Christ, that our concern for others may reflect your love. We ask this through Christ our Savior. Amen.
