#### Christmas with an X?

You may have seen Christmas written as X-mas. This can seem to be a disrespectful way spelling of Christmas and this may be the intention for some. Nevertheless, spelling Christmas as "Xmas" is deeply Christian. The first letter of Christ in Greek is "chi" which looks like our letter "X". It is still common in Christian art to use the first letter or the first few letters to stand for an entire word. For instance, you may have seen in Catholic churches or on the priest's vestment "IHS". These are the first three letters of Jesus in Greek. So, far from being a secularization of Christmas, Xmas is legitimate abbreviation of Christmas.

#### Prayer by St. Francis Xavier




#### **Christmas Art: The Visitation of the Shepherds**

The cover of the bulletin this Sunday is the same image on the cover of the book that I made available at the beginning of Advent (*The True Meaning of Christmas* by Michael Barber). The more I looked at that nativity painting on the cover of that book, the more meaning I saw packed within it.

The name of the painting is *The Visitation of the Shepherds* by Bartolome Murillo. He painted it around the year 1668. Here are some features of this rich painting.

First, Jesus is at the center. He is the focal point as well as a source of light in the picture. Baby Jesus has a brightness to him because he is the light of the world, who enters into our darkness. Mary is genuflecting before her divine Son. She is presenting Jesus to those present. She joins them in gazing on and adoring Jesus. The angels at the top of the painting represent heaven rejoicing that God has been born in Jesus Christ.

The three men in the background looking down upon Jesus are the shepherds. Each of the shepherds has a slightly different posture. The one on the right has his right hand extended as if he is both pointing at Jesus and offering something to him. The middle shepherd has his hands folded in prayer as he looks upon Jesus. The shepherd leaning on his staff on the left just silently gazes on Jesus. There is not strict uniformity in their posture. Nonetheless, they all respectfully come before the newborn king and adore him. The character that most intrigued me was the man in the foreground. His is wearing black with tattered clothing. His black clothing is in stark contrast to the infant before him who radiates with light. The soles of his feet are all dirty. He probably travelled a long distance to come to adore the newborn king. As he kneels before the Christ child, his right hand is placed upon a lamb. The lamb with tied legs is an image of Jesus who is the lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world. This man in the foreground presents the following challenge to each of us: How far am I willing to go, how much energy am I willing to exert, how much discomfort am I willing to undergo so that I can come before the Lord and adore him?
