From Your Priests

The Epistle for today is the beginning of the book of Revelation, also called the Apocalypse, which is simply a Greek word that means "revelation." It is crucially important to understand that in the Bible there are different genres of literature; for instance, the wisdom literature, prophecy, history, and apocalyptic literature. An example of apocalyptic literature in the Old Testament is the book of the prophet Ezekiel. St. Jerome himself, the great translator and scholar of the Bible, who was completely fluent in all the languages of the Bible, referred to Ezekiel as "the labyrinth of the mysteries of God." Because of its difficulty, Jews were not allowed to read it until the age of 30. Not a bad idea in my opinion. With regard to the book of Revelation, then, one should read it, but read it with care, with maturity, and with the mind of the Church. Many, unfortunately, have fallen into outlandish interpretations by not doing so.

Donations for the Needy

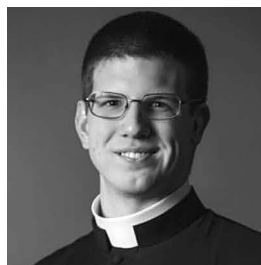

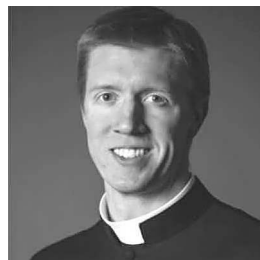
