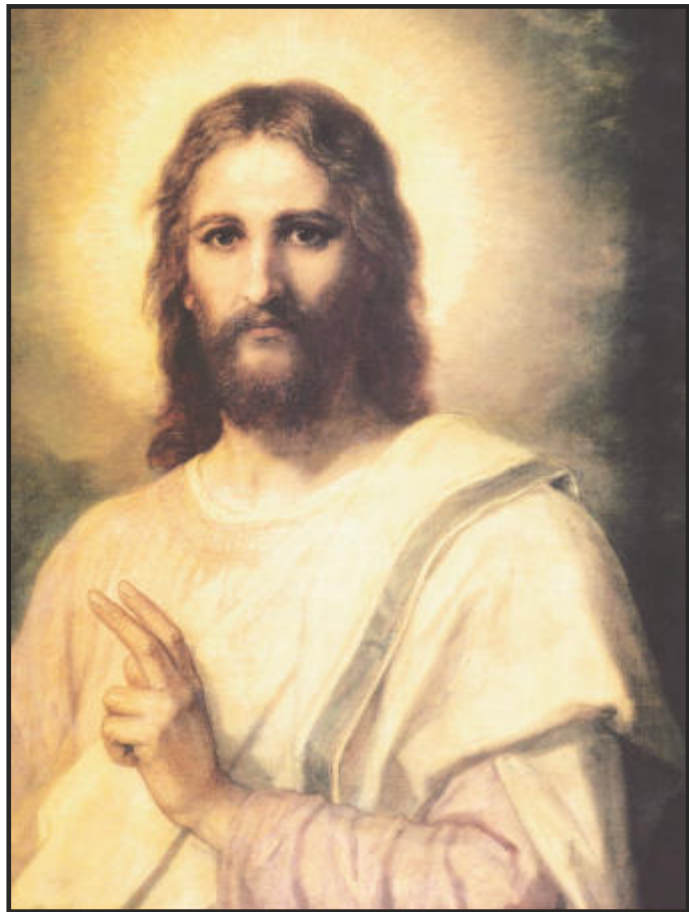

May Crowning

On Sunday, May 9, we will continue the annual tradition of demonstrating our devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary by symbolically crowning her as our Queen. May Crowning will take place at the beginning of the 10 a.m. Mass. Children up through age 14 are asked to bring flowers for Our Lady and line up in the vestibule of the Church at 9:50 a.m. for the procession to the front of the Church after Father and the altar servers process in. The children then will process to the front of the Church, genuflect in the center and then bring their flowers to Father, who will place them around Our Lady's statue. After giving your flowers to Father, return to your pew. Finally, one of the girls of the parish will crown Our Lady.

Rogation Procession and Mass

Each year on the Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday immediately preceding Ascension Thursday, the Church gives the option of having a special procession and Mass called "Rogation." That word comes from the Latin *Rogo, Rogare* which means "to ask" or "to beg." On these days, we beg God's protection from storms and other calamities which might destroy our crops, property or tranquility of life. The ceremony has ancient origins and involves a procession through the fields chanting the Litany of the Saints to beg God's blessing on the fields for the coming growing season and to beg protection from storms, pests and other calamities. Farmers are usually much more mindful than us city folk of the constant dangers which threaten our food source. The constant news of disasters and calamities around the world should move us to humility and remind us of our helplessness and need for complete dependence on Almighty God for protection.
