



SYNOD ON SYNODALITY



A few weeks ago, I shared with you that Pope Francis is having a special synod in which parishes are to participate. The idea is that the Pope wants parishes to communicate about core issues of parish life for the sake of developing a culture of "Synodality." What does that mean? Essentially, it means an

inclusionary attitude of listening to those who may not always be listened to, in order to help us better understand the Church.

Included in the bulletin this week, there is a questionnaire we would invite you as parishioners to reflect upon. The questions have been put together by the Parish Council and reflect core principles of the Catholic faith. Our hope is to have a large number of parishioners and non-parishioners respond to these questions (feel free to share them with friends who are non-parishioners, including non-Catholics).

We have designated a reporter to take these responses, summarize them, and send them to the Diocesan representative who will then send them to Rome. The summaries will also be shared with parishioners to help us understand how we can use the Synod as a means to help build up St. Olaf Parish.

In that spirit, I would ask you to prayerfully reflect on these questions. Type (or write) out answers to these questions and send them to the parish office. We would like to have them returned by the **24th of January**. This will give our reporter enough time to summarize the responses and send them to the Diocese.

We will then provide a copy of the summary to the parish so we can continue to reflect on this important question: *What is God asking of us as St. Olaf Parish?*

ST. ELIZABETH ANN SETON | JANUARY 4

The patron saint of Catholic schools, St. Elizabeth Ann Seton (August 28, 1774 – January 4, 1821) was born in New York City to a prominent family of the Episcopal faith. When she turned 19, she married a wealthy businessman with whom she had five children. He later died of tuberculosis in 1803, leaving her a young widow. After discovering the



Catholic faith in Italy, where her husband had died, she returned to New York and converted to Catholicism in 1805.

After several years struggling as a single mother, Elizabeth moved in 1809 to Emmitsburg, Maryland, where she founded the Sisters of Charity of St. Joseph, the first community for religious women established in the United States. She also began St. Joseph's Academy and Free School, which started a chain reaction of Catholic-based education in the United States that continues today.

St. Elizabeth Ann Seton was canonized September 14, 1975 in St. Peter's Square by Pope Paul VI and was the first citizen born in the United States to be given the title of "saint." ©LPi

The Light of the Moon

If you own a television that has been turned on at any point in the last month or so, chances are you've caught at least a scene or two of the 1946 classic film "It's a Wonderful Life."



If you're not familiar with the movie, it follows

the life of George Bailey from childhood through adulthood. A dreamer by nature, George has big plans for himself that involve world exploration and adventure — but family and community obligations keep him tethered to the same spot on the map, leading an altogether ordinary life.

One of the most memorable scenes from that movie is of George dancing with his sweetheart Mary while they sing "Buffalo Gals — Won't you come out tonight/And dance by the light of the moon?"

That lyric always catches my ear. Of course, the moon doesn't have any light of its own. All the moon has is the ability to reflect the light that shines upon it.

The same holds for us, doesn't it? Our stewardship is purely a reflection of the grace granted to us by another. "Upon you the LORD shines," writes Isaiah, "and over you appears his glory." Every good action we will ever take begins in the mind of God. The fact that we have the honor of carrying it out on His behalf is a beautiful gift. It is God that makes our ordinary lives extraordinary.


In the end of the movie, George Bailey realizes that he had a far greater life because, instead of being the hero of his own story, he allowed himself to reflect goodness onto others.
