-Our Savior is Here!-

Today we celebrate the birth of our Savior. Christmas is a beautiful time of year, it is colder outside, but many homes are filled with the grace of the season that brings warmth into the home. The seasonal repetition of year after year lets us think of good memories and look to make new ones. And whether we realize it or not these feelings of the season, these good feelings, are because our savior has impacted us and the world. Christmas cards speak of this reality. I like looking through different Christmas cards and reading the short pithy, brilliant ways that they summarize the truth and beauty of the season. Example: "This Christmas, may God open our hearts to His love... our minds to His wonders... our ears to His voice... our lives to His presence." So many about letting God's love and presence into our own lives and hearts to let His love impact and save us.

The core of the Christmas celebration is to rejoice that we have a savior. To no longer fear our weaknesses and failures and the fact that we need a savior. We can embrace the reality that we can be redeemed and any and all mistakes that we made in the past can be redeemed, because we have a savior. We don't have to expect that we should be perfect to be able to fulfill tasks or problem solve. We don't have to feel frustrated that we need saving. This is our cause for rejoicing. The first step is to acknowledge our need for a savior and the next is to rejoice that we have one, a savior to help us through life's challenges. The step after taking this truth to heart is to recognize others are in the same boat as we are. We shouldn't be surprised when we see other people, that they too, are in need of a savior. How often do we think to ourselves, how come they don't have it all together? How could they think the way that they do or act the way that they do? Perhaps we think uncharitably, 'that idiot.' We are in need of a savior and that should not surprise us. This Christmas rejoice that our savior has come, that He is here, but don't beat yourselves or others up because we need a savior, trust in Him and let Him work.

When you look at this babe wrapped in swaddling clothes, let Him redeem your past. Let Him have your sins, your weakness, your failings, your strengths, your successes. Let Him own them and redeem them. Let His love and His WORD come into your heart. Let Him into our human past and present to Heal it and redeem it. The whole project, the whole plan for salvation is to bring us, human beings, to God, to be healed restored, forgiven, not that we fear the glory of God, but that we can be made able to see the full glory and rejoice. To see God as He is and not fear, but love. This is the transformation and renewal that God desires to bring about this Christmas and always.

And the beautiful thing is that the more His love and WORD are in us, the better we are able to see the glory of God. The more we are united to Him and share in His life, the more we see His glory living in us. So, this Christmas behold the glory of God, see God made visible in this babe rapped in swaddling clothes and laying in a manger and let that glory transform you and come to life in you, to be redeemed and saved!
