

-Ordinary Time-

What is so ordinary about Ordinary Time? Afterall, with Christmas and the birth of our savior everything has changed, there is a path for human beings to move forward and be saved. And we know that God is with us so there is reason to give God constant thanksgiving and praise.

For me one of the ways that I have come to appreciate the liturgical season of Ordinary Time is to be reminded that another title for Jesus is the Good Shepherd. A shepherd leads his flock to different pastures to keep the sheep from overgrazing the different pastures. This is good for both the sheep and the land. As I look to Jesus as the Good Shepherd I see that He feeds me and nourishes me with His Word and His WORD made flesh in the Eucharist. We began the new liturgical year with Advent hearing about the promises of the Christ coming into the world, as well as the promises of Jesus to return at the end of time. We looked to Christ's first advent in His birth to give us the reassurances of His faithfulness in His promises to return. And we heard His word about His return to prepare us. Then we entered the season of Christmas hearing about and meditating on The Incarnation, God becoming our Brother to save us, perfectly taking on a human nature to redeem it. As we transitioned from Advent to Christmas the Good Shepherd led us to a different pasture so to speak, nourishing us differently with His Word. Now we enter a new more wide-open field.

Often, we don't think about the transition from the Christmas season to Ordinary Time. But if we think about it in the Christmas season we celebrated the birth of Our Savior that He is Emmanuel God with Us, and that He was born into this world to give us new life, supernatural life. And so, when we think about this transition into ordinary time, it helps us to see that what the church means by ordinary is the new ordinary life for Christians. That we have new life in Christ. That we are to live knowing that God abides, lives with us and in us. This new life with Christ means looking to Him hearing His teaching allowing Him to continue to strengthen us by giving us His word and His very body that gives us life in the Eucharist. Much of the proclamation of God's Word that we here during Ordinary Time is teaching that helps us live our Ordinary human life with God and for God. We don't have the Big moments of Salvation like the Birth or Death and Resurrection the celebrate and think deeply on, but we can take on the steady diet of God's wisdom and love.

So, this ordinary life for Christians is the life with God, with God living within us. And this is something that we don't want to forget as we move away from the Christmas season, that we still think about this new life that our savior was born to give us. We call the truth of the Christmas to mind every time we hear the Gloria, but now Jesus is nourishing us with other truths. My hope is that reflecting on God as our Good Shepherd in this way helps you to appreciate Ordinary Time and the way that Jesus feeds us to keep us healthy and connected to Him.
