

-Sabbath—It's Beauty-

In the law, the Sabbath is a sacred day of rest and a sign of the covenant between God and His people. The importance of the Sabbath is expressed in that it is one of the ten commandments. Of the commandments, this day of rest is one that we easily, and wrongly, dismiss. We allow the pull away from rest to be too strong to resist. But here is what we miss, a day dedicated to God, family and friends. One of the challenges to our thinking is that we tell ourselves God will always be there, and therefore He will understand, but the subtle truth is that we are slowly breaking away from His covenant, we are walking further away from God. God is not moving, we are. And as we lose our connection to God, we lose our wonder and admiration for our creator and also creation. Creation begins to be a burden, not a blessing, God becomes a burden not a blessing.

The Sabbath day honors our humanity. A beautiful thing about the Sabbath and dedicating it to the Lord is that it helps us as human beings to always be reminded that there is a transcendent reality, that there is something greater than what we see or what we experience in the world, that there is a God, who watches over us, who keeps us, who provides for our every need. Some may say, 'Well, why is being open to the transcendent such a beautiful and important thing?' And the answer is what we see and experience in our lives when we become overly busy, we become exhausted, depressed, anxious, we lose our ability to be creative and to problem solve. So, the more that we open ourselves up to the transcendent, the more that we are able to find rest in God, the better able we are to be creative and problem solve. Imagine entering a greater majority of your weeks with issues sorted out and problems solved. Then the peace of God lives in you as you have chosen to live more fully with God and in His covenant. God commands the Sabbath of us because He knows that if we never stop from work, we busy ourselves and invite in depression, anxiety, frustration, and God desires to protect us from that.

The Sabbath is the sign of God's covenant. This helps to structure our lives and priorities. As Christians, the Sabbath was moved from the seventh day of the week to the first day of the week, Sunday in recognition of the new creation that was inaugurated by the resurrection of Jesus on Sunday. We keep the Sabbath on Sunday because everything that we are toiling for, everything that we're living for, are the hopes won for us in the New Covenant Christ gave us. These hopes were revealed on the First Day of the Week, the Day of the Resurrection. Now that Jesus rose from the dead, we order and prioritize our lives toward the life of the resurrection to come. We rest with God who has died and rose again for us. We want to live the resurrection so we live the New Sabbath. We let this New Covenant give us New Life as God makes us new and prepares our hearts and minds to live in Him eternally in the New Heavens and New Earth to come.

My encouragement for us is to live for the Sabbath, to really and truly live the Sabbath rest, to find our peace in with and through God, that our anxieties worries, fears, dissipate through our commitment and love of God and his covenant with us. That over time as we surrender to His plan for us, we experience within our souls the peace this new creativity and ability to problem solve with God give us.

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

We discover again the sacred character of life and the wonder of God's power. It is no wonder that Luke addresses his remarks to Theophilus.
