Pastor's Desk

This past week we turned the calendar over into August. For many people, this marks the beginning of the end of summer as our thoughts begin to turn to school, which for most students will be starting in a short week and a half! It is in that light that I also begin to think about our CCD program (technically CCD stands for "Confraternity of Christian Doctrine") which is our catechetical program for our K-8 students who attend the public schools. Due to the pandemic, we made some adjustments to our program last year. At this point, we are planning on returning to our normal schedule for CCD with in-person instruction. With that in mind, I would like to request that all the CCD textbooks that were taken home last year be returned over the next few weeks. You can either drop them off at the rectory or you can leave them on the table in the narthex. Registration forms for CCD were recently mailed out to all returning families. If you are a new family, registration forms are available in the back of church. Please return these registration forms soon as we really would like to get a grasp of our attendance numbers for planning purposes.

As we look at these practical items, this time is also a good time to reflect on our more overarching need to continue to form and educate our children in the faith. The Second Vatican Council reminds us that parents are the primary educators in the formation of their children in faith. The local parish, in this case, us, St. Patrick parish, stands ready to assist parents in this sacred duty. After 26 years of priesthood I have found it absolutely true that the parish cannot make up for a lack of faith formation in the home. The parish can be an essential partner in the work of formation, but we cannot replace the parents and the life of faith in the home. Additionally, we face the immediate need of people to step forward to assist as teachers. A love of our faith and a desire to share that faith is the only irrevocable requirement. I would ask you to listen to the whispering in your heart of God's voice and see if He is calling you to this essential apostolate, for without you, we cannot carry out this essential program of assistance to parents. At the end of the day, we are but the pencil in the hand of God, it is HE who works through our humble efforts, and it is HE who transforms and shapes our hearts. Maybe you are the pencil HE wishes to write with in this apostolate?
