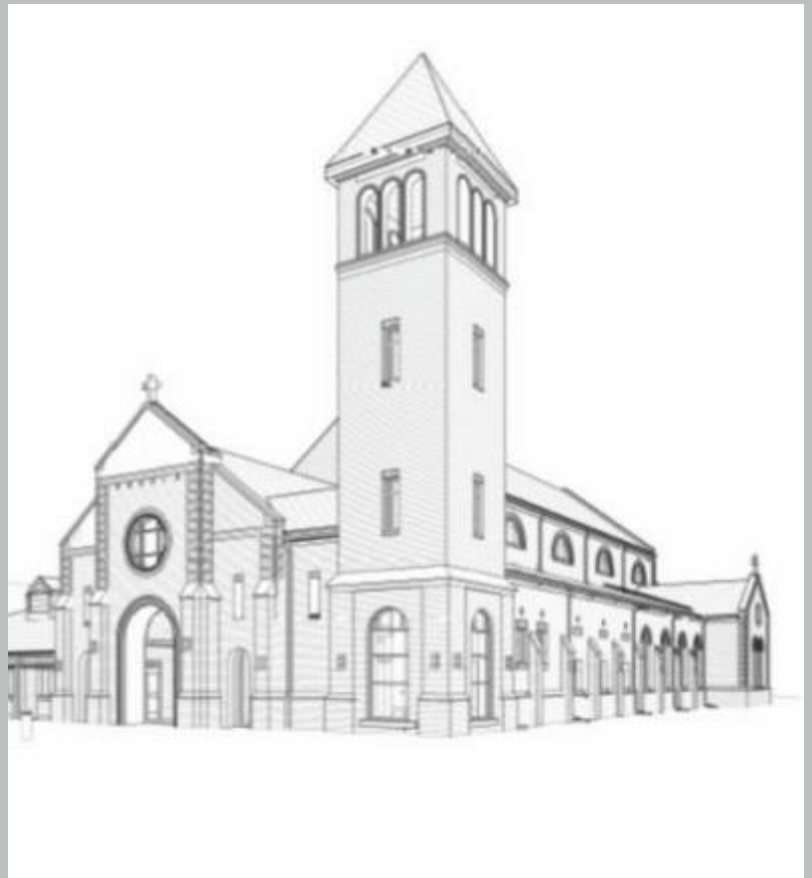

## From the Pastor's Desk

Last weekend we were privileged to host some seminarians from St. Gregory the Great Seminary, our diocesan minor seminary. They spoke to us after communion about life as a seminarian and in regard to the Bishop's Appeal for Vocations. This year the overall cost to educate our 25 diocese of Lincoln seminarians is 1.245 million dollars. Of that total cost to educate our own seminarians, The Bishop's Appeal for Vocations goal is to provide \$800,000. In addition to the appeal, the seminarians collectively will be contributing \$45,000 for their education and seminary endowments and burses will add another \$325,000. All three of these sources together defray the total cost. Your contribution to the Bishop's Appeal is an essential part of making sure that there will be future priests to serve all of our spiritual needs, not only at St. Patrick's, but the entire diocese. A few years ago the mechanism for the Bishop's Appeal for Vocation was changed. As you may remember, previously, St. Patrick's was given a goal to try to reach. As was done the last couple of years, the Bishop has determined that this goal is now changed to an assessment. What this means is that St. Patrick's will be assessed the difference between what we raise and our goal. Last year, our parish raised the full amount of the assessment in the appeal, so we did not have to draw from our general budget! I was humbled by the great support you showed for our seminarians. The amount assessed to St. Patrick this year is \$13,080. On a separate note, this Bishop's Appeal hits home on a personal level as pastor of St. Patrick's because Fr. Doher, a parishioner, was ordained for our diocese only a few years ago. A native son of St. Patrick was supported throughout his education through your generosity to this appeal. On a humorous note, I like to refer to the seminarians as my long term retirement plan! On a more serious note, the seminarians truly are your future priests. At some point, seminarians studying now will be the pastor and/or parochial vicars of St. Patrick's! Finally, I want to thank-you for your support of our future priests. If you haven't had the chance to do so yet, please stop in the social hall and pick up your pledge card and return it in the collection in an envelope marked "Bishop's Appeal for Vocations".

As the women at the well, in John 4, we see that women found fellowship at the well. Yet this woman, was ashamed of her sins and felt like she didn't belong, so she went

later, after the others had left. Yet Jesus met her at the well, gave her new life and new hope. She met Jesus, came to know him and loved him. She went out to tell others. Everyone is welcome!

## Library Corner

There is so much to know about our Catholic faith...not only its theology or its structure, but its many liturgies, prayers, hymns, language, pious practices and its long and complicated history. Needless to say, considering all this, there is probably a lot that we do not know. Sometimes we have questions ourselves, or have questions put to us, and we would like to have an answer. There are a number of books in our parish library that help to answer a lot of these questions. Here are three of them.

***Why Do Catholics Do That?*** (1994) by Kevin Orlin Johnson is a very readable, interesting book that you can use to simply look up a particular item, or you can read all the way through. It covers basic information on the Catholic faith (for example, "How the Church Makes Laws"), worship (for example, "The Ceremonies of the Christian Funeral"), or customs (for example, "Making Sense of Incense"). It is a fascinating book with some good back stories. One caveat: It may be a bit outdated here and there since the Church continues to refine its message.

***The Catholic Source Book*** (2000) by Rev. Peter Klein is a most helpful book that covers all kinds of topics ranging from heady subjects such as Scripture, Church, and Liturgy to topics such as devotions, and word and phrase origins. It has all kinds of interesting tidbits set off in easy to spot boxes. The chapter on the saints, for example, contains a (very!) long list of patron saints. For example, the patron saint of engaged couples is St. Agnes; of comedians, St. Vitus, and of television, St. Clare. She never watched TV, but she had the gift of bilocal sight, or the ability to see far-off places and events.

***The Catholicism Answerbook*** (2007) by Rev. John Trigilio, Jr. and Rev. Kenneth Brighenti asks and answers the "300 Most Frequently Asked Questions" about Catholicism. For example, one such question is, "Where did the Holy Days of Obligation Come From?"

All three of these books list their Nihil Obstat and Imprimature, and all three have a very helpful (and necessary) index. There are other books like these on various topics in the library. We hope to have a reference section set up for them in the near future. We hope you make use of them.
