From the Pastor's Desk

Shortly after Pope Francis was elected to be the Pope, he directed the highest ranking members of the Roman Curia (ie the Cardinals in charge of various departments) to take turns hearing daily confessions at the Church of Santo Spirito in Sassia, an ordinary Roman church outside the Vatican. All throughout the time Pope Francis has led us, he has emphasized the beauty and importance of confession. He has pointed out that:

"God never ever tires of forgiving us! "Well, Father what is the problem?". Well, the problem is that we ourselves tire, we do not want to ask, we grow weary of asking for forgiveness. He never tires of forgiving, but at times we get tired of asking for forgiveness."

Advent is a great season to allow the Holy Spirit to enkindle in our heart a desire for God's beautiful gift of mercy. Pope Francis beautifully reminds us that

Forgiveness is not the fruit of our own efforts but rather a gift, it is a gift of the Holy Spirit who fills us with the wellspring of mercy and of grace that flows unceasingly from the open heart of

the Crucified and Risen Christ."

Confession, therefore, is to encounter the love of Jesus with sincerity of heart and with the transparency of children, not refusing, but even welcoming the "grace of shame" that makes us perceive God's forgiveness. But so often this is difficult for many. Why? It is not easy to truly face ones sins, to say as did St. Paul "good does not dwell in me, that is, in my flesh." But in taking up the challenge we ultimately find freedom. To say with humility, "I am a sinner", opens a place in our heart for God to say "I forgive you" and pour out the soothing ointment of mercy. What better way can we prepare to welcome Christ than to prepare a home for him that is beautiful, the home of our soul freed from sin and darkness. This week we have extra confession times scheduled: Sunday 4-5 p.m. and 7 -8 p.m.; Monday 6 - 7 p.m.; Tuesday 5 - 6p.m.; Wednesday 6-7 p.m.; Thursday 6:30-7:30 p.m.; Friday 8:30 - 9:30 a.m.

Library Corner

Have you wondered at times what momentous events such as the birth of Christ were really like? We have the account from the Bible itself, but sometimes we may find ourselves wishing for more details. There have been many attempts to fill in those details by many writer/scholars, and one such book is on our parish library shelf. It is titled The Day Christ Was Born by Jim Bishop. In this fairly short book, Bishop ventures to reconstruct the Bible story, but he does not tamper with the facts. He merely "sets them off in a reconstructed context," according to the book's introduction. The added elements are the product of the author's research, and the result is a very readable account of the birth of Jesus told like a story, giving the reader a worthy picture of that marvelous event...good reading for Christmas. (Bishop's reimagining of the Christmas story has the approval of an Imprimatur and Nihil Obstat.) The book sits on a shelf with other Christmas books, Christmas DVDs, and CDs. Check them out. It's Christmas time!

P.S. There is another copy of this book, but it is there in a heftier volume along with Bishop's other account, *The Day Christ Died*.




