From the Pastor's Desk Fr. Troy Schweiger January 16, 2022

This week we continue to examine the theological and spiritual meaning of the newly installed decorative painting. Last week we examined the meaning of the murals under the clerestory windows. This week we examine the pendentives in the side aisles. The pendentives in architecture are the curving triangular segments of vaulting, which support a dome and rest upon a column. This is the location of the recently installed artwork above the side aisles in the nave.

When looking upon these paintings, we first see geometric shapes and flowery designs that form a pattern. We recognize many of these designs from the secular world. When we analyze their meanings from a nonsecular and Christian point of view, we discover so much more than mere decorations. After examining the pendentive murals from this perspective, you will appreciate their worth from a whole new understanding.

Therefore, we will focus on the five main components of the two alternating patterns of the pendentive artwork:

- The acanthus leaves are the wavy, leaf-like shape that repeats itself throughout the art. This design dates back to ancient civilizations and is traditionally thought to mean immortality and enduring life. Jesus, through his death and resurrection has brought us the possibility of enduring life and immortality in union with God. Its origins are in the Mediterranean.
- The *large circle* is a shape that dates back to the ancients, also. It means the same to us now as it did then. The circle means eternity because it has no beginning or end just as Jesus is the beginning and end of all Creation. He is the Word through whom the universe was created and He is the End of all Creation in so far as He will invite us into union with the Father at the end of time.
- The *cruciform shape* that is in the middle of the circle is recognized as the Cross.
- The *iris figure* found among the acanthus leaves, especially in the long banner mural, represents Mary and purity. By its petal shape, it can imply the sword that pierced her heart at the foot of the Cross.
- The *rhombus or diamond* shaped form within the long banner of ornamentation has several meanings. It is also known by the terms "logos" and "lozenge."

*This shape dates back to Early Christianity and has been found on oil lamps referring to the "Light of the World."

*During Byzantium (330 AD – 730 AD), the rhombus is said to be associated with the Four-Square World and Earth, Water, Fire and Air. During this time period, the diamond shape can be interchangeable with the Cross. It also represents the second person of the Trinity, the Word of God made flesh; the Logos, which is Jesus Christ. *It may be interpreted as the fourth day of creation.

*It is common in Russian art and it is known there as the lozenge.

*The rhombus was used as a symbol of courage and strength during the Renaissance (1400's to 1500's).






