LETTER FROM OUR PRIESTS

Friends,

This weekend we have the incredibly well-known writing from St. Paul about love from his first letter to the Corinthians. St. Paul wasn't just "waxing philosophical" about an abstract theory of love but was making a strong assertion to his people that love was, and is, the most fundamentally important reality in the Christian life: love of God and love of neighbor.

He is contrasting this with the temptation to be attached to great spiritual gifts like prophecy, tongues, healings, mighty deeds, etc., as the early Christian community seemed to have been struggling with wanting these "powers" to prove their discipleship rather than seeking to grow first and foremost in love. It seems the people of Nazareth in the Gospel were the same: seeking miraculous signs from Jesus to prove He was the Messiah.

Are we the same? The truth of the matter is, we should always approach seemingly-miraculous signs, wonders and visions with a healthy skepticism until the Church weighs in on such things. Not only can human beings be deceived or confused, they can also be deceitful- to say nothing of the evil one who loves to "disguise himself as an angel of light" and deceive us. How good it is, then, that God makes the measure of our spiritual life our love and union with Him and others, rather than the performance of seemingly-mystical deeds.

An excellent (if not a little cliched) examination of conscience is to take the word "love" in St. Paul's letter and substitute our own name. It becomes an excellent way to see where we still need to grow. It also is a wonderful exercise to re-examine our image of God, by substituting the word "love" with "God" and ensuring our image of God matches the image of revelation. May the God of love lead us to be ever-more fully united to Him.
