******* PRIEST'S MESSAGE *******



And suddenly there was a multitude of the heavenly host with the angel, praising God and saying: "Glory to God in the highest/ and on earth peace to those on whom his favor rests."

-Luke 2:13-14

Consider how amazing it is that the angels rejoice as much as they do. At the announcement of the Christ Child, the angels dance all over the sky with an enthusiasm that would put 4th of July fireworks to shame. They sing, too: *Glory* to God in the highest/ and peace to his people on earth! The shepherds would have heard a chorus of angelic voices that was unthinkably loud in the ancient world.

Huh. The way the angels celebrated, you would think that God had become an angel. But he didn't. God became man.

It is said that after God had created the heavens and the earth, He gathered all the angels of heaven together in one place. To them He spoke in confidence. The Lord told them of His plan to unite Himself to His creation forever. Everything sounded great up to this point. The angels were the strongest and most intelligent creatures that God had created, so it seemed only natural that God would become an Angel. One, Lucifer, outshone all the others. When God told them all that He intended to become a Man. Lucifer rebelled along with a third of all the angels of heaven. The two thirds that remained faithful to God rejoiced--they are the angels the shepherds heard.

In this octave of Christmas--the eight day celebration of the solemnity of Christmas--we celebrate Emmanuel, or God-with-us. Although we are grateful for the angelic voices, we are the ones who should shout, dance, and sing, not the angels. About 2000 years ago, God, as a child, sat in a classroom



next to other children learning his letters. God, as a young man, worked alongside stinky, hard-working laborers. Today, God dwells not with the angels. He dwells body, blood, soul, and divinity within us when we receive the Eucharist. So let us rejoice. God is with us!




