


♦♦♦ PRIEST'S MESSAGE ♦♦♦



Being a follower of Christ means the Cross.

A few years ago, a foreign exchange student asked me questions regarding the faith. She had come from a culture with very little Christian influence. She asked, "why does God allow the Christians to suffer so much if He is so powerful?" Her question is a reformulation of "the problem of pain":

namely why do bad things happen to good people.

Although I won't (really can't) answer the problem of pain in this little article, I do want to point out that Christians look at pain and suffering very differently than others. For us, the model isn't some person who lives completely free of pain, with riches and convenience all about. Instead, our model is Christ--a man beaten and despised, who came in poverty and nakedness into the world. If he is our model, we shouldn't expect to live lives without pain. We should expect that the cross will very much be a part of our lives.

Father Michael Schmitz is fond of pointing out that in this life, we are not traveling on a cruise ship; we are traveling on a battle-ship. If we expect that we are going to be waited upon hand and foot, to be comforted and entertained at every turn, of course we will be disappointed by our passage through this life. But if,

instead, we recognize that this trip through life is about our battle against evil...well, battles require discipline, self-restraint, and, especially, endurance of great pain and difficulty.

We are not traveling on a cruise ship; we are traveling on a battleship. That means that like Christ our Lord, we must expect to live with discipline, self-restraint, and even great pain and mockery.



Our Lord endured these things: let us show ourselves worthy to be His followers. Let us take up our crosses this Lent and follow Him.

Divine Mercy Chaplet. In the past few years, I have become very attached to the Divine Mercy devotion. This devotion helps us to do two things: (1) It helps us recall that both ourselves and the world REALLY need God's mercy. "Have mercy on us, and on the whole world." Thus the Divine Mercy chaplet becomes a reflection on our own sinfulness. (2) It also helps us remember to offer the sacrifice of Jesus our Lord up to the heavenly Father. "Holy Father, *I offer you* the body and blood, soul and divinity, of your dearly beloved Son, Our Lord Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world." In this part of the prayer we remember that we need the sacrifice of the cross (the sacrifice of the Mass) and we should be eager to offer it. I encourage you to take up this devotion if you haven't already. It takes less time than saying the rosary.

The Stations. Continuing that same thought...Anyone who is serious about Lent starts to see how much he or she fails, and is in need of God's mercy. Therefore, as Lent progresses, the Stations of the Cross become more and more meaningful. We NEED Christ to bear the cross for us! Consider this ancient and powerful meditation not only on Fridays of Lent, but other days as well. The churches are open.




