

******* PRIEST'S MESSAGE *******



"Each one of them is Jesus in disguise." ~ Mother Teresa

When did we see you Lord? In the story of Christ's judgment of the sheep and the goats, both those who served the hungry, naked, imprisoned, etc... and also those who did not,

asked the same question. When did we see you Lord? They didn't see him in the fields of corn, nor at work, nor at the mall. He didn't have a TV camera in his face all the time; nor did he receive adulation as he paraded down main street. But why would we have expected him to appear the same as a rock star? Jesus proclaims to us, "I am meek and humble of heart". He says that those are happy who are poor, who hunger and thirst, who are persecuted--like him. Jesus is the suffering man if there ever was one. So shouldn't we expect to see Jesus hungry, beaten, and in prison?

I heard a story about a priest who walked into a hospital room, just like all the other rooms that he had visited that day. A very sick women was only breathing with a machine: a tube down her throat. Very sedated, she probably didn't even know that the priest was there, but the priest figured God's grace could act regardless. As he reached for the Oil of the Sick, all of a sudden, she was transformed. It was Christ beaten and bruised lying in the bed. The priest rubbed his eyes and shock his head. When he looked again, the woman was as she was before.

Failing to see Christ in others often means we fail to take care of Christ in need. In the world there are too many starving, too many homeless, too many sick. Meanwhile we sit in comfort and indifference--like the rich man, indifferent to Lazarus. Jesus separated the sheep from the goats. The sheep cared for him; the goats failed to care for him. He uses this as a criteria for judging between his true servants and those who just say they belong to Christ. We must take care of those around us--or and those far away from us--or risk the same judgment as the "goats".

Although the parable of the sheep and the goats is surely a warning for us to take care of all those around us, it is also an invitation to change our vision: we can see Christ around us everywhere, if we have eyes to see. This takes practice. Surely, we have to look for Christ in *all* those around us. Yet, as one group pointed out after serving at the Banquet food bank, it is easier to see Christ in the poor and the sick than it is to see Him in our friends and neighbors. The hospitals, jails, and streets may be a good place to start looking for Christ this Lent.

Our motivation to love others can become, therefore, an act of worship to God. Perhaps this is the truest meaning of *Almsgiving*. In order to love God, we sacrifice our own desires (fast), and serve Christ in others (almsgiving).


