

♦♦♦ PRIEST'S MESSAGE ♦♦♦



One of my favorite places in my hometown is the cemetery. Does this sound a little weird? Maybe it is, a little. But the cemetery has much to recommend it. It is just down the road from my parents place. It's quiet—a place for me to escape from noise and busyness. It overlooks the beautiful Missouri River valley and the Oahe

dam. And it is a little rugged…like South Dakota itself. But aside from all that...it is a cemetery. It is the place where our beloved dead rest.

All cemeteries remind us of death. And that's a good thing. All of us would live better, more focused lives if we considered that our time on this earth was very limited.

All cemeteries remind us of our hope of resurrection. They remind us what Jesus has won for us. These tombs are like the tomb of Jesus. Like our Lord Jesus, these people are destined to rise again from the grave-not with decayed bodies like zombies, but with resurrected bodies like the Lord Jesus. Won't it be wonderful when our bodies are sound and strong like the resurrected body of the Lord?! But for now those who have died, rest in death–asleep until the end of the world.

All cemeteries give us a chance to reconnect with our deceased loved ones. In some parts of the world, a cemetery is called a Necropolis: which literally means a "city of the dead". The fact that it is a city implies that it is full, not of mere bones or dust, but of real people. Although the souls of these people are separated from the bodies, they continue to BE the people they were before. So, for example, this body does not cease to be your grandfather iust because he died.

And this has consequences for the way we live. When we show care for the body of our deceased mother, we are caring for her. When we speak toward her tombstone, on some level we are communicating with her. When we pray a rosary in her cemetery we are praying for her. When we put flowers at her grave we are showing respect and honor due to her. I remember hearing about a family who had a tradition of going to the cemetery every holiday -thanksgiving, Easter, Memorial Day. The family would gather at the graves of their relatives, pull out lawn chairs, and have a picnic there with all their relatives, living and deceased.

In just a few weeks we will have another great opportunity at our Sacred Heart Cemetery. We will have a Mass offered for the repose of all their souls on Memorial day. I hope many of you will take advantage of this opportunity to teach your children and grandchildren how to care for the bodies of our deceased family members.

Our own Sacred Heart cemetery is maintained and cared for by a very generous hired groundskeeper, a great number of volunteers, and a dedicated board of trustees who watch over it

throughout the weeks and months. If you have any interest in helping to sustain and care for the cemetery, please contact the office to let us know.






