

AREA CATHOLIC COMMUNITIES

Gathered, Nourished, Sent

Today we celebrate the Feast of the Most Holy Trinity. St. Thomas Beckett, a saint and martyr, celebrated a liturgy in the honor of the Trinity in the 12th century. This solemnity was placed on the church calendar to follow Pentecost Sunday in the 14th century. According to legend, St. Patrick used the three-leaved shamrock to explain the Holy Trinity to the Irish people. Like any analogy, the shamrock has its limitations. The Trinity cannot be explained by only one line from the Bible.

When we start and end a prayer we use words and actions: "In the name of the Father (touching our forehead), and of the Son, (touching our lower middle chest) and of the Holy Spirit" (touching first one shoulder and then the other). AMEN.

When you enter church, you dip your hand in the Holy Water.... And make the sign of the cross. We are invoking the Trinity with this action.

From Christmas through the Ascension we talked about Jesus, who came for ALL of us. On Pentecost, the Holy Spirit descended on the community. It's not about us as individuals; it is about our community with fellow humans and with all creation.

Today we move into Ordinary Time. This Sunday and next Sunday are special days designated as solemnities. A solemnity calls our attention to the central mysteries of our faith. At the end of today's Gospel we are reminded we are to carry forth the mission of Jesus, "Go therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age". (Matthew 28:19-20)

We are meant to live this mystery of our faith. Through our Baptism we share in the life of the Trinity. We seek others to share in God's love.
