PASTOR'S CORNER

Second Sunday of Easter

"Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained."

Pope St. John Paul II is the one who declared the 2nd Sunday of Easter as the Sunday of the Divine Mercy. As it turns out, the early Church celebrated this, but it had sort of drifted away over time. St. Maria Faustina of the Divine Mercy was a religious sister in Poland just prior to World War II. She prophesied many things. One was that the convent where she lived would not be taken over during the war. She was correct.

The mercy of God is probably one of the deepest substances of God that is the hardest to comprehend. We more easily connect with the justice of God. The depth of His mercy is incomprehensible. Yet we are called to live His mercy here on earth. "Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained."

Think power that each of us has when it comes to mercy and forgiveness. We can hold others in chains or set them free. Either way, we are accountable to the God who has redeemed us from justified sin and death. May we be judged according to the mercy and forgiveness we practice in our life.
