

17TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME





FROM FATHER STARMAN

Dear Parishioners and Friends of the Catholic Parishes of Western Holt and Boyd Counties,

Why do we pray? It is not to impose our will on God, but to ask God to make us available to the divine will and to share our concerns with God, to place these under God's loving judgment. It is, therefore, not an effort to change God, but to change ourselves. Of all the evangelists, it is Luke who speaks most about prayer. His gospel begins (1:10) and ends (24:53) in the context of prayer. At significant moments in his life, Jesus prays, and his example leads the disciples to ask him, "Lord, teach us to pray just as John taught his disciples" (11:1). The Lukan version of Jesus's response is direct, shorter, simpler than Matthew's (Matt 6:9-13) and expresses the deepest reality of Jesus's relationship with his God, into which he wants his disciples to be drawn. The words are no magic formula; they help us to realize the personal reality of the One to whom we pray.

Our familiarity with the Lord's Prayer may blunt our appreciation of its radical, even subversive, teaching about prayer. It is to be the prayer of a community that is conscious both of its intimate relationship with God and its presence in and respon-sibility for the world. In both testaments, God is "Father," a metaphor vastly different from that of the powerful Roman emperor, the "father of the homeland," or the au-thoritarian father of the family social unit. Especially in the gospels, God is the Abba of Jesus, in loving, faithful, and intimate relationship with the Beloved Son. The kingdom for which disciples pray is not a kingdom of political power, but one that belongs to the poor, the liberated, excluded women, forgiven sinners. That we may be changed, we pray for bread, forgiveness, and deliverance.

Given Luke's emphasis on hospitality, prayer for "our daily bread" is prob-ably a request for this basic necessity that should be shared with the poor. We also need to be nourished with one another's forgiveness, because God will never starve us of forgiveness, and God's behavior must be the norm for his sons and daughters. To live in this way will save us at the time of "the final test." The only other time that Luke uses the same word for "test" or temptation is again in the context of prayer in Gethsemane, when he urges the disciples, who slept while Jesus prayed, to "get up and pray that you may not undergo the test" (22:46).

The Lord's Prayer is no magic formula. It is an instruction about the Father to whom Jesus and his disciples pray. Jesus affirms what should be the qual-ity of our prayer by telling two parables, both of which describe situations to which the response to "Just suppose" would be "Never!" What is described in the parable of the Friend at Midnight concerns three friends: the one who arrives unexpectedly, the host, and the one to whom the latter goes to ask for bread because he has run out of his own supply. To fail in hospitality by not being able to offer the barest sustenance to a friend and guest would be shame-ful, and if the third friend did not unbolt his door and help out, his shame would be the talk of his neighbors who no doubt would hear the midnight disturbance!

If we are in an enduring relationship as prayerful "friends" with God, we can be assured that God will be hospitable to us in our need.

Anointing of the Sick

In the Church's Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick, through the ministry of the priest, it is Jesus who touches the sick to heal them from sin - and sometimes even from physical ailment. His cures were signs of the arrival of the Kingdom of God. The core message of his healing tells us of his plan to conquer sin and death by his dying and rising. The Rite of Anointing tells us there is no need to wait until a person is at the point of death to receive the Sacrament. A careful judgment about the serious nature of the illness is sufficient. The Pre-Vatican II teaching was different in that the Sacrament of Extreme Unction was to be administered as close to the point of death as possible. Vatican II doesn't completely reverse the previous teaching but it does provide the opportunity for individuals to experience God's grace and mercy earlier in their physical, mental or spiritual struggles. When the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick is given, the hoped-for effect is that, if it be God's will, the person be physically healed of illness. But even if there is no physical healing, the primary effect of the Sacrament is a spiritual healing by which the sick person receives the Holy Spirit's gift of peace and courage to deal with the difficulties that accompany serious illness or the frailty of old age. The point of all this is we are asking people to not wait until the *last minute* to call for a priest to come and anoint them or a family member or friend.


