## ANOINTING OF THE SICK

In the Church's Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick, through the ministry of the priest, it is Jesus who touches the sick to heal them from sin - and sometimes even from physical ailment. His cures were signs of the arrival of the Kingdom of God. The core message of his healing tells us of his plan to conquer sin and death by his dying and rising. The Rite of Anointing tells us there is no need to wait until a person is at the point of death to receive the Sacrament. A careful judgment about the serious nature of the illness is sufficient. The Pre-Vatican II teaching was different in that the Sacrament of Extreme Unction was to be administered as close to the point of death as possible. Vatican II doesn't completely reverse the previous teaching, but it does provide the opportunity for individuals to experience God's grace and mercy earlier in their physical, mental or spiritual struggles. When the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick is given, the hoped-for effect is that, if it be God's will, the person be physically healed of illness. But even if there is no physical healing, the primary effect of the Sacrament is a spiritual healing by which the sick person receives the Holy Spirit's gift of peace and courage to deal with the difficulties that accompany serious illness or the frailty of old age. The point of all this is we are asking people to **not wait until the last minute** to call for a priest to come and anoint them or a family member or friend.

# FROM FATHER STARMAN

Dear Parishioners and Friends of the Catholic Parishes of Western Holt and Boyd Counties,

The Jewish heritage of Jesus is full of imagery of elusive, purifying fire. "I AM" speaks out of it; the pillar of God's fiery presence leads the Hebrews through the desert nights, sparks out on Sinai, burns in temple lampstands of pure gold, licks up the waters of Carmel, and anoints the lips of prophets. In the fullness of time, the holy fire takes flesh in Jesus, the Earth Firelighter of this Sunday's gospel. Perhaps we are never more conscious of this than when we gather in the dark-ness around the Easter fire. The leaping flames celebrate the fulfillment of Jesus's strong desire and determination to engulf the earth with the fire of his Spirit after he has suffered the "baptism by fire" of his passion and death.

Those who follow Jesus will not only be warmed and enlightened by him; inevitably, they will also feel the painful heat of their association. Sadly, some aspects of even the most intimate relationships with family and friendship may be scorched, or even totally destroyed. Earlier in Luke's gospel (3:16-17), that uncompromising precursor, John the Baptist, spoke of a baptism that would be greater than his purificatory rite: a baptism with the fire of the Holy Spirit that the Messiah would enkindle. Those whose lives were husks, empty of any repentance or commitment to the Coming One, would not be harvested into the kingdom, but would be burned in "unquenchable fire." Read in context, what John is speaking about so strongly are issues of social justice: sharing with the disadvantaged, nonviolence, and economic integrity. From the time he announced his mission in the Nazareth synagogue, this was also the burning social commitment of Jesus (Luke 4:16-21).

A fire that was familiar to the inhabitants of Jerusalem was the garbage being burned regularly in the Valley of Hinnon (Gehenna) just outside the city. But there is another and blessed fire that is to be lit from the person of Jesus himself, who burns with a wild love for the world. This is emphasized by the personal repetition: "I have come," "I wish," "I must be baptized," "I have come" (a second time), "I tell you." For Jesus to speak of himself in the first person in the Synoptic Gospels is extremely rare. It is an indication of the urgency that he wishes to communicate to his listeners. The adult Jesus who is speaking was the child whose birth was announced as heralding peace (Luke 2:14) but was also recognized by Simeon as a source of division (2:34). The two are not incompatible. Jesus's peace is not a warm, fuzzy glow, a comfortable satisfaction with the status quo. Rather, it is a burning decisiveness that results from the self-discovery and discernment Jesus experienced in the wilderness—that fierce place of temptation and commitment. Out of the wilderness he was driven on mission by the power of the Spirit, ready to live, suffer, and die for his God (3:1-14) and the salvation of the world.

This mission has nothing to do with the *pax Romana* (or the *pax Americana*). Those who follow Jesus share his experience by becoming part of it. It is significant that, in this gospel text, Jesus speaks so passionately not of extraordinary, dramatic suffering but of the intimate, painful divisions and misunderstanding that the choice of discipleship can cause in families. A close and faithful relationship to Jesus will influence all our other relationships in terms of values and priorities.
