

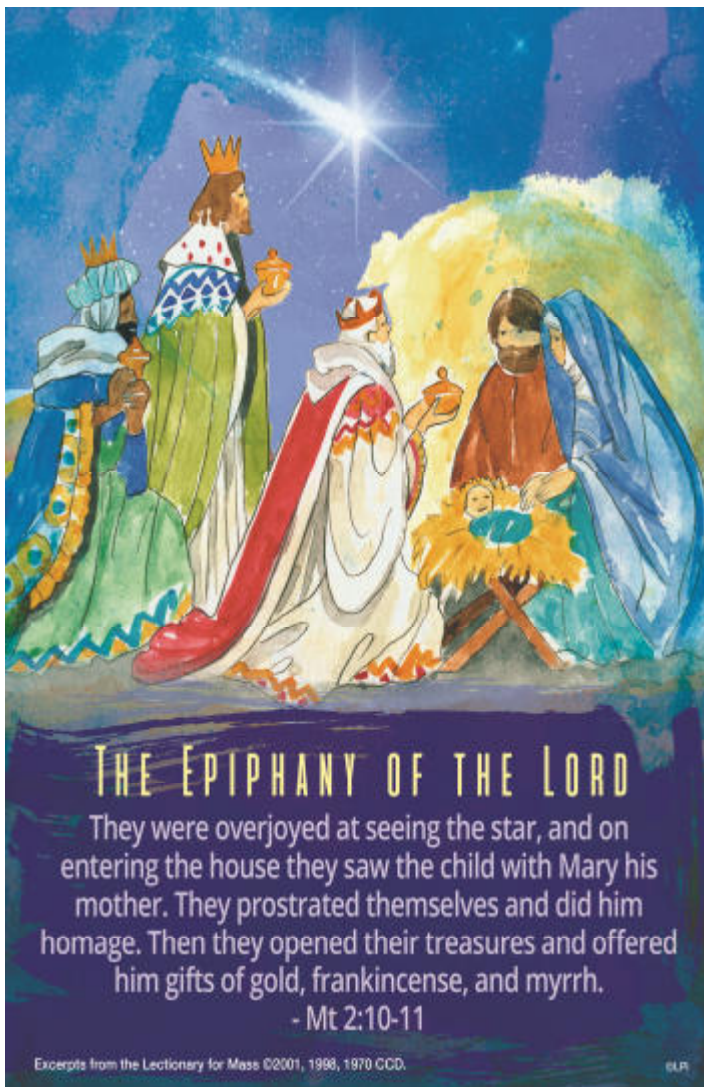

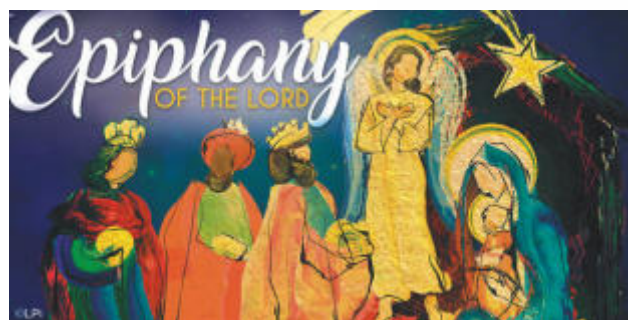

iii) A third group -- shepherds and the Magi -- adored Jesus and offered themselves and their humble gifts to him. The Magi offered gold in recognition of Jesus as the king of the Jews, frankincense acknowledging that he was God, and myrrh as a symbol of His human nature.

Messages: 1) Let us make sure that we belong to the third group. a) Let us worship Jesus at Holy Mass with the gold of our love, the frankincense of our adoration, and the myrrh of our humility. b) Just as the Magi chose another route to return to their home, let us also choose a better way of life in the New Year by abstaining from proud and impure thoughts, evil habits and addictions, and selfish behavior. c) Let us also become the Star leading others to Jesus by selfless service, unconditional forgiveness, and compassionate care. Thus, let us become the Epiphany of Jesus' presence for others by radiating His light all around us. 2a) Like the Magi, let us offer Jesus our gift of friendship with God in the form of wholehearted love and devotion. b) Let friendship with others be our second gift to Jesus expressed by humble service. c) A third gift might be the gift of reconciliation expressed by our readiness to forgive offenses. d) The fourth Epiphany gift is the gift of peace. It is securing God's peace in our own lives through prayer, sacramental life, and daily meditation on the Word of God.

Pastor's
Reflection

Dear Parishioners,

The word Epiphany means *appearance* or *manifestation*, and it marks Jesus' first appearance to the Gentiles. "Epiphany" refers to God's self-revelation as well as the revelation of Jesus as His Son. The feast commemorates the visit of the Magi as the first manifestation of Christ to the Gentiles in the Western Church. In the Eastern Church, it is the commemoration of the baptism of Christ. The angels revealed Jesus to the shepherds, and the Star revealed him to the Magi. Later, God the Father revealed Jesus' identity at His baptism in the Jordan. Still later, Jesus revealed himself as the promised Messiah in the synagogue at Nazareth. These multiple manifestations are all suggested by the Feast of the Epiphany.

The three gifts - gold, frankincense, and myrrh - mentioned in Matthew's gospel gave rise to the sixth-century Italian tradition that there were three Magi - Casper, Balthazar, and Melchior. The Orthodox Church holds that the Magi consisted of twelve kings corresponding in number to the twelve tribes of Israel. Commentary on the Torah by Jewish rabbis suggested that a star appeared in the sky at Abraham, Isaac, and Moses's births. Hence, stars were believed to be signs from God announcing important events. So, when the kings "saw his star at its rising," they understood it to mean the birth of a King and went to pay him homage. Gold was a gift for kings. Frankincense was an ancient air purifier and perfume. It was offered to God in Temple worship. Myrrh was an oriental remedy for intestinal worms for infants, and the High Priest used it in the anointing oil and preparing bodies for burial.

Today's gospel also suggests three reactions to Jesus' birth: hatred, indifference, and adoration. i) A group of people headed by Herod planned to destroy Jesus. King Herod considered Jesus a potential threat to his kingship, and hence he ordered the mass murder of babies. Like cruel Herod, many oppose Christ and his Church from selfish motives, evil ways, and unjust lives. Children still have Herods to fear because the United States aborts annually over one and a half million innocent babies. ii) A second group composed of priests and scribes ignored Jesus. The Scribes, Pharisees, and the Jewish priests knew that there were nearly 500 prophecies in the Hebrew Scriptures concerning the promised Messiah. They were able to tell Herod the exact time and place of Jesus' birth. Unfortunately, they were more interested in their own selfish gains than in discovering the truth. Today many Christians remind us of this group. They practice their religion from selfish motives such as political power, prestige, and recognition by society, and ignore Jesus' teachings in their private lives.

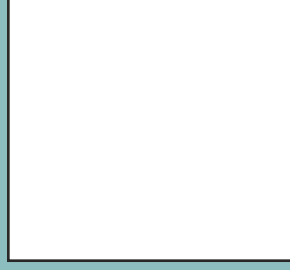

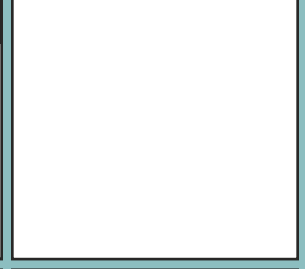
