A MESSAGE FROM FR. KRIS THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER

These past couple of weeks we've heard about the days following the Lord's Resurrection from the dead. We recall that, through the Paschal Mystery, Jesus conquered sin and death reconciling the human race with the Father. Through the written accounts of Jesus' appearance to His disciples and apostles, we hear Jesus' repeated actions to strengthen His disciples and restore their hope, faith and trust. He knew that their faith in Him was shaken. He knew that they were hiding in fear, and He wanted to bring them out of fear and back to hope and trust in Himself.

On the one hand, it's easy to be critical. After all, they heard Jesus' words and promise that He would rise from the dead after three days. At the same time, though, there's often a difference between hearing and really understanding, and we're told in the Scriptures that their hearts were not yet opened. We can't be too tough on them for this. Sometimes, we hear something, but we don't always hear what was said, but rather what we expect to hear. We tend to interpret things through our own lens.

In our own lives, though, we know the faith. We sometimes miss the glory of the message that's being given. We often believe in our heads that Jesus is the way, the truth, and the life, but have a hard time allowing that to really sink in. We find our own faith shaken. Whenever we turn on the news, we hear the list of everything that went wrong in the world. Recent revelations in the Church world can certainly shake our faith. We hear of sinful, illegal, and scandalous acts committed by those we trusted, and we may wonder if Jesus was telling us the truth. We know He did, but we may have a difficult time staying committed to Him. (On that note, I have to express my own admiration for all of you, who are still devoted to the Lord in spite of those who did not live the faith, and sinned horribly, and now publicly.)

Like those early disciples, we often need encouragement in the Faith. We can encourage each other, and that's essential. St. Paul told us to say the things that men need to hear, to edify them. But all the human reassurance in the world doesn't add up to even a little bit of God's grace, and it's His grace that carries us. Every Sunday when I look out at the congregation, at full or mostly full churches, I see God's grace at work through your presence and in your prayers. You're still here, following the Lord and encouraging one another (and me).

While at Mass, we are there for Jesus. We're not there for the priest, the music, or even our friends. Those all help, but ultimately, we're here to worship God through the prayers of the Mass. And, because God is goodness *per se*, He gives us a gift better than anything we could hope for, something that's too good to believe; in the Eucharist, Jesus gives us His very self. We may not feel any different after receiving the Eucharist, and generally don't, we know that it is the Lord giving Himself to us to help and strengthen us.

Through the Eucharist, Jesus gives us grace through the Sacrament to more fully follow Him. This is why it's so important for us to go to Mass every Sunday, and even during the week if possible. When we excuse ourselves from Mass, we exclude ourselves from the grace and strength that God wants to give, and to live the Faith, we need His grace. Jesus gives Himself to us in the Eucharist as an ongoing gift because He wants us to follow Him and remain in a friendship with Him.

Jesus loves us infinitely, and knows that away from Him, we don't find everlasting peace and happiness. Through His death and resurrection, He conquered sin and death and gives us hope. Through His death and Resurrection, He changed everything in the world and opened the gates of Heaven to those who have faith in Him. Be strong in Him, be strengthened by Him and follow Him into eternal life and happiness.
