**+ A MESSAGE FROM FATHER KRIS +**  
**TWENTY-FOURTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME**

I'm really starting to feel like a broken record when I say this, but it's been a really strange year. Just when I thought we were going to get a little break from what seems to be an endless cycle of bad news and relax a little, something new comes up that throws us for a loop. And that happened this past week when I heard the news that our Bishop-elect resigned following a recently made allegation dating back to the early 1980's. I have to say that my heart sunk. While we don't know the veracity of the allegation, every time I hear of someone who may have been abused by a priest, I'm deeply saddened. If the allegation is true, my heart breaks for the abused, and if not true, my heart brakes for the accused. Either way, I feel a deep sadness.

With every piece of bad news we've had over the last year, I've found my trust in God gets a little shaken. I spend a day or so wondering how much we can endure. I start to wonder if it's worth taking up the cross daily and following Him, or if the Lord is even paying attention. I find myself having to be very deliberate in finding some reason for hope.

In the past, I've always turned to the Lord in prayer, sometimes just offering the simple prayer: "Jesus, help." I've often found it helpful to simply spend some quiet time in the Lord's presence in the Blessed Sacrament, just sitting with Him knowing that whatever prayers I offer will be perfected by the Holy Spirit and carried to Him by the Blessed Mother. As of late, I have to say that I've found great solace in the Sorrowful Mysteries of the Rosary, especially in Jesus' Agony in the Garden.

For some reason, it seems easier to see Jesus' physical suffering while He was carrying the Cross, being scourged at the pillar, being crowned with thorns, and His death on the Cross. We don't always take note of Jesus' emotional suffering at Gethsemane, or recall the suffering that, in His humanity, He must have felt as He was facing trial before the Sanhedrin. As He was in the garden praying, knowing the death that He was about to face, the sins He was about to forgive, and the suffering He would undergo, the Scriptures tell us that Jesus sweat blood. So intense was His emotional distress that his heart raced, His blood pressure increased and His capillaries burst.

It's easy to forget the intensity of Jesus' emotional suffering as he prepared to take up the Cross and save the world. But, if we remind ourselves of that suffering as well, we can't help but be reminded of His infinite love for each and for all of us. We're also reminded that there is no suffering that we can face that He hasn't experienced, and the words from Lamentations come to mind: "Is there any suffering like my suffering that was inflicted on me...?" And He willingly endured all this to save the world from the mess of sin we'd gotten ourselves into.

Because of Jesus' salvific work, even our suffering has been redeemed and transformed. Rather than being something that should be avoided, suffering becomes a means for deeper union with Christ. When we face any form of suffering, physical or emotional, we have a share in the Cross that we can offer back to the Father in union with Christ... the saints of the Church encourage us not to waste the suffering, but to use it as prayer... and as a way to gain insight into the suffering Jesus went through out of love for us.

Even though our faith and trust in the Lord may be initially shaken with every bad news story that's out there, we can be moved to a deeper union with the Lord, which is the goal of this life. If our faith isn't challenged, it won't grow and we can easily become complacent and spiritually lazy. But, in life, God allows our faith to be challenged so that we may grow closer to Him and learn, little by little, how to more fully depend on God's wisdom, power, and love.
