Pastors 2 Cents: From Fr. Jim DeBruycker

In psychoanalytic theory, the story of Adam and Eve is the story of humanity coming to consciousness. Once we could differentiate 'me' from 'us', the world was never the same. The Greek philosophers actually believed we were once a whole and the gods split us into male and female. In both instances the result is a longing to be one again and regain Paradise, or wholeness, to go home again.

In his novel, *You Can't Go Home Again*, Thomas Wolfe reminds us we can't capture the past and return to it unchanged. You change and the world changes and we have to adjust to it. To try to do otherwise can lead to disappointment or disaster...at the very least. I recently went to my 50th College reunion. It was fun to reconnect with people I have not seen in thirty years in many instances. On the surface there was a lot of banter that sounded like the 'old days' but underneath was the realization we are not the same people. The trauma, the drama and the experiences of life have changed us. We came together to visit something that once was but is no longer. I longed for more time to discover these new people.

Wow! This is way too philosophical a musing on the concept of 'Welcome Home Sunday.' We are glad to see you after the summer hiatus of travel, camp and cabin and the beginning of a new school year blending into another holiday and liturgical season. At my first parish, Saint Peter's in Mendota, when I was much more liturgically inclined, I designed a whole welcome back for the Christmas program. We had special services planned and great Christmas card-like graphics...and it was a complete disaster. "What's home about this place?" was a number of people's responses. I didn't do my homework; there was a whole list of Catholic resentments. To call something home doesn't make it home.

Can you go home again? No. But you can create a new home. I saw this a lot during the AIDS epidemic. I often ended up working with two different families with the same person, their birth family and their gay family. With luck and time sometimes we could blend the two together, but not very often. To many, the gay family where they could be themselves, accepted and nurtured, was this family of peers—their new home. Home is where your heart is.

So, welcome back to this manufactured home where we will celebrate some old familiar stuff while recognizing that your journey has changed you and challenged you, and made you more interesting. Let us nurture and enrich each other for another season. As always, we welcome you wherever you are on your journey and hope you feel at home.
