Pastor's 2 Cents: From: Fr. Jim DeBruycker

In the seminary I wrote a paper on black Catholics and the civil war. As you have probably guessed the American bishops were split like the country over the issue of slavery. There were a number of bishops who supported a 'just slavery' stance or suggested that emancipation take place gradually so the blacks could learn how to live free responsibly. Interestingly Rome was way ahead of these bishops and declared there was no moral justification for American slavery. In a local American council after emancipation and the civil war the bishops admitted emancipation was a good thing but should have been done gradually.

Hopefully that sounds as crazy to you as it does to me. Whenever the power structure tells you that you should receive freedom gradually so you can live it with responsibility they are really saying we are having a hard time letting go of our power and control. The patriarchy likes to pretend they are a beneficial parent only looking out for our own good when in reality it's their power they are protecting. We see this happening all around us right now on a variety of issues concerning racial discrimination, women's rights, and LGBTQ rights to name a few.

We are not supposed to bring up these issues because it might disturb our young people's psyche. We cannot admit that each of us carry inner tapes taught to us by our culture that have to be laid bare to finally end our hatreds and prejudice. As a youngster I was taught to lock the car doors and roll up the windows when we drove through the Selby-Dale area. Don't look at 'those people' as we drove through the neighborhood. We were indoctrinated with these myths and they don't go away unless you expose them.

The Gospel this week tells us how the kingdom gradually grows bit by bit until it will finally come to fruition. It is the story of hope, we can get there we can build a better world. We have evidence of this all around us, from the strides made in racial equality, women and LGBTQ rights to the incredible advancements made in medicine in the fight against cancer, AIDS, and other infectious diseases. There is hope in this world. But there is more to be done.

I know I am preaching to the choir but we must be vigilant. We need to keep hope alive. There are many out there who are repeating the old patriarchal mantra. You are going too far too fast we need to tell you how to live. Really?

Make Someone's Day! Studies have shown that the power of even a smile has long ranging effects on the mood of not only the recipient of a smile, but the sender as well! Improve someone's mood this week, as well as your own, by 'committing' random acts of smiling!
