## Pastor's 2 Cents: From: Fr. Jim DeBruycker

Amos is the classic Hebrew Prophet, he is often taught in scripture class as the paradigm of prophets. He is reluctant to take on the mantle of prophet, he argues with God over it, none the less he does it, he confronts authority with justice, nobody listens and he returns to his former occupation awaiting their destruction.

Amos tries to point out to the ruling class that there is an enemy approaching and they better be prepared for his coming. They ignore him, more worried about their pleasure and power. They have ignored the common people even going so far as to defraud the poor of what little they had. Unprepared, their kingdom is destroyed and they are led into captivity.

What goes around comes around, few prophets could be more pertinent to our times as is Amos. We face a decision, allow ourselves to surrender our power to an individual or work for the common good. As in the past we confuse wealth, power, and fame with intelligence. We waste time arguing over age rather than look at the community which surrounds our leaders. What principles guide their followers, self-aggrandizement or the common good?

Jesus sent out his disciples two by two, so they had support for each other, into a stratified world of haves and have nots. People were classified by the status of birth. Pedigree almost always trumped talent. A vast portion of the world were slaves who held no position other than what their owners gave them. Into this world his disciples preached a Gospel which said all were equal in the eyes of God. All were offered healing and forgiveness, whatever their status.

We are the disciples now sent out into a hostile world and there are enemies approaching masquerading as champions of justice. What would Amos do?
