If so, would you like to be reimbursed as a respite care worker? 

### Missouri Property Tax Credits (MOPTC)

Are not only for homeowners, some renters are included too! Feb. 1st is the first day you can apply. For more information contact Dianna Englander at 816-256-8096.

If you rent from a facility that pays taxes, and you are 65 as of 12/31/21, disabled as a result of military service or 100% disabled otherwise, were 60 years of age or older as of December 31, 2020 and receiving surviving spouse social security benefits. **AND** have maximum income for renters who meet the above criteria is \$27,000 for a single person, combined household income \$29,200. **NOTE:** if 100% service connected disability – do not include VA payments. Maximum income for a single person household is \$30,000 and combined income \$34,000.

Depending on your income, you could get a tax credit of up to \$1100 by filing for the Missouri Property Tax Credit. Documents needed to file in February, 2022: Social Security 1099's (also any other income statements for 2021)Rent paid (if you rent from a company that pays taxes) or home property taxes paid for 2021. **Contact Dianna Englander, 816-256-8096 for details.**

# Tech Talk Tips!



### Winter Scam Alert Tip:

Remote Tech Support Scams are purported by scammers all year. They have devised a plan to separate you from your money, information, or your identity. You might have responded to a message or email that says your computer might be vulnerable, or your computer was compromised, and they can help you fix the problem, (that probably never existed anyway). Sometimes they charge for this service.

How to spot the scammers: They often claim to be from a big name company like Apple or Microsoft, Norton, etc.. They claim to know about a problem with your computer. (You have never reported one.)

### **BIG CAUTION FLAGS:**

They will,

- want you to allow them to remotely access your computer.

- ask for a large amount of money for services

- say you may have won money but they need to access your computer.

- say the offer will cost more later or try to rush you into a decision, always say you need to consult your tech adviser first, and ask for their return phone number.

- ask for payment via gift cards or direct access to your bank account.

If you have encountered any of these scammers, let us know here at the Technology Center. If you have questions about something you have entered into and cant get out of, we can help. Tasty Totes and the Mobile Food Pantry are offered on a first-come-first-served basis. We continue to offer these as drive-through programs and ask that participants remain in their vehicle. Please enter the parking lot at the south entrance on NE 56<sup>th</sup> Street and pull up to the front of our building where our volunteers will load up your items.

"Hunger is a serious threat facing millions of seniors in the United States. In Missouri, as many as one in eight seniors are struggling from day to day to have a sufficient food supply. The percentage of older adults facing the threat of hunger is also known as the rate of senior food insecurity. The Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services (DHSS) released its <u>2018 Senior Food Insecurity Report</u>. The first of its kind in the nation, this report is an in-depth state level study and analysis of the factors contributing to senior hunger. The Senior Food Insecurity Report illuminates the prevalence of senior food insecurity members, health professionals, public officials and decision makers at all levels to come together and take a deeper look at the causes of senior hunger by highlighting potential solutions to address the growing prevalence of senior food insecurity. Approx. 170,000 MO seniors are food insecure." MO Dept of Health & Senior Services **Northland Shepherd's Center is proud to be a part of the working solution to this problem.**
