Missouri Property Tax Credits (MOPTC)

Are not only for homeowners, some renters are included too! Feb. 1st is the first day you can apply. For more information contact Dianna Englander at 816-256-8096.

If you rent from a facility that pays taxes, and you are 65 as of 12/31/21, disabled as a result of military service or 100% disabled otherwise, were 60 years of age or older as of December 31, 2021 and receiving surviving spouse social security benefits. Maximum income for renters who meet the above criteria is \$27,000 for a single person, combined household income \$29,200. **NOTE:** if 100% service connected disability – **do not** include VA payments. **Maximum Income** for a single person household is \$30,000 and combined income \$34,000.

Depending on your income, you could get a tax credit of up to \$1100 by filing for the Missouri Property Tax Credit. Documents needed to file in February, 2022: Social Security 1099's (also any other income statements for 2021) Rent paid (if you rent from a company that pays taxes) or home property taxes paid for 2021. **Contact Dianna Englander, 816-256-8096 for details.**

Tech News

In case you haven't heard, there's a move to replace and sunset all 3G devices. This change is due to implementation of faster networks like 5G. Older 3G devices like cell phones and some security systems

will not work after the change. Many will stop working on February 22, 2022, which is the first round of device updates. The good news is that you may already know about those devices and have replaced them by now. iPhones older than the iPhone 6 may not work and older than a Samsung Galaxy S4 may be affected. If you have a newer phone, it may just need updated. Go to your carrier's website and check if your phone is included. Besides phones these other devices may have relied on older 3G networks: security systems, some medical devices, portable hotspots, e -readers like Kindle, etc.

What to do with that old device? Best Buy will recycle the old devices, most have a box in their stores. It is best to remove old data or reset your device if possible. If you have any questions about this change, call the Technology Center 816-621-2084.

CHIA PUDDING... a healthy snack!

These little seeds seem to be showing up everywhere, with good reason. They're a great source of fiber which is all-monies for keeping your GI tract working,. Just 2 tablespoons pack 8 grams of fiber and 4 grams of protein, chia seeds are also a good source of minerals like calcium, iron and heart-healthy omega-3 fatty acids. To whip them into a great snack option, try an easy-to-make chia pudding. In a small glass bowl, whisk together 2 tablespoons chia seeds with 1/2 Cup milk or your choice. (If you use a nondairy milk, be sure to choose an unsweetened one)



Allow to sit for 2-3 minutes, then whisk again. Cover and refrigerate for at least 2 hours and up to 5 days. When you're ready to eat, add fresh fruit, dried coconut, nut butter or any other toppings you like.

Nutrition

Tasty Totes fresh produce bags are still being distributed on the **second Thursday (March 10th and April 14th) of the month at 9:30am.** We want to keep our tenants and neighbors happy so we can continue distribution until the new pantry is open. Cars CANNOT block the drive to the back of the building and we need to be respectful of the neighborhood around us and NOT block driveways during your wait or as you are pulling up to the car in front of you. The next distribution we are going to try something different and ask that you enter through the North entrance of the lot by following the map below.



Our **Harvesters** food distribution is the **fourth Thursday of each month at 9:30am.** So mark your calendars for Thursday, March 24th and Thursday, April 28th as the **Harvesters Mobile Food Pantry and Commodity Supplemental Food Program (CSFP) distribution**. If you would like more information about the CSFP and to see if you qualify, call Kelley at

816.844.3964.

Tasty Totes and the Mobile Food Pantry are offered on a first-come-first-served basis. We continue to offer these as drive-through programs and ask that participants remain in their vehicle.

CAREGIVER SUPPORT

Are you a primary caregiver in Clay County Missouri? Are you caring for someone who is 60 years of age or older? Do you live in the home with the recipient? If so, would you like to be reimbursed for a respite care worker? Caregiver Directed Respite Program provides reimbursement funds to families to assist in obtaining respite care for a family member. Income of care recipient cannot exceed \$3014 a month for individuals or \$4058 a month for a couple.
