For Reflection: Commitments involve expectations

When we make a commitment, there are certain expectations involved. If we commit to a relationship, we are expected to be loving, respectful, and faithful. If we commit to a job, we are expected to be on time and productive. If we are not willing to put forth the effort required to meet the expectations, we should not enter into the commitment.

The same is true in our commitment to God. We are expected to be His disciples in all we think, say and do. Yet God knows that we are not perfect. As long as we continue to pick ourselves up when we fall short and ask for forgiveness as we try to do better, then we are fulfilling our end of the commitment. And God, in His ever-loving mercy, sent Jesus to give us hope and to be our strength along the way.

So the next time we are tempted to “like and share” a Facebook post - the content of which would make Jesus cry - remember that this is not how to live our commitment. When we have our children receive sacraments and then do not take them to church, this is not how to live our commitment. If we are believers, we must whole heartedly commit.

Each of us on our baptism day was promised to God that we would be raised in the faith. Today, 70% of Christians in America do not attend any type of worship service.

If these children are not baptized, how will they hand on the faith to their own children and grandchildren?

How to Joyfully Offer Prayer

Many Protestants are remarkably at ease with evangelization. They are quite comfortable asking perfect strangers, "Do you know Jesus?" or "Have you been saved?" They are also comfortable with spontaneously praying with a stranger. Sadly, most Catholics are not. Catholics know a variety of beautiful prayers we can pray, but spontaneous prayer from the heart is often difficult and challenging.

However, we should make every effort to become more comfortable with this type of prayer because it is one of the most effective ways of evangelizing. It is one of the best ways of showing even a complete stranger you care about them and that is why prayer is important for evangelization. Prayer also has the power to bring God's gifts of healing, mercy, and peace to the person we are praying for and with.

Let's Propose a Prayer Model to Help us!

- This type of prayer is called Intercessory prayer.
- There are three simple components (PTS):
 1. Praise ; 2. Thanksgiving; 3. Supplication
- Ask the person what they need prayer for in their life?
- Start with the sign of the cross. Then pray: "Almighty God, we praise and thank you for the many good gifts you give us each day." (Praise)
- "We thank you for the opportunity to be here today with (person's name)." (Thanksgiving)
- "We ask you to bless [name] and fulfill [name] needs." (Supplication) "We pray (or ask) this in Jesus' name. Amen."
- End prayer with the sign of the cross.
- Ask them how they feel.
- Assure them of your continued prayers.



Try it with someone this week and see how it goes. Not only will you bless the person you are praying with, God will bless you for being His instrument of love and kindness for others.
