From the Pastor's Pen



Today's celebration of the Baptism of the Lord brings to a conclusion the Christmas season. Although John's baptism was different from our Sacrament of Baptism, today gives us an opportunity to reflect on the gift of our own Baptism. "Through baptism we are freed from sin and reborn as children of God. We become members of Christ, are incorporated into the Church made participants in the mission of the Church." Catechism of the Catholic Church 1213.

Our baptismal preparation program for infants and young children consists of a single class with the parents. It makes matters easier for the parents if they take this class before the baby is born but afterwards works as well. This class usually takes place once a month.

At Baptism parents renew their responsibility to raise their children in the Catholic Faith. This is an important duty and privilege. Baptism should take place the first few weeks of life. To have one's children baptized at St. Therese we ask that at least one parent be a registered parishioner.

Sometimes it happens that people from outside the parish, perhaps someone who grew up here, would like to have the baptism at St. Therese. In that case, we ask them to have a letter from their parish giving permission for the Baptism to take place here. Similarly, sometimes parents who are parishioners here would like to have the baptism somewhere else. In that instance, they would attend a baptismal preparation class here and we would provide them with a letter for where the baptism is to take place.

In the case of a life threatening illness, one of the priests or deacons would strive to get to the hospital as soon as possible to baptize the child.

Godparents play an important role. They will have a spiritual relationship with the child baptized. Rather than simply being the nearest relative or best friend, they are people who parents hold up to their children as living examples of the Catholic Christian life. To be a godparent, one must:

1. Be over the age of 16;
2. Have received the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and First Communion; and
3. Be a practicing Catholic (this includes attending Mass regularly, and if married, to be married in the Catholic Church and to not be in an irregular situation such as cohabitation, etc.)

There need only be one godparent but if there are two, they are to be gender specific, i.e., one godfather, and one godmother.

Sometimes it happens that there is a friend or special relative who parents would like to have as a godparent who is not Catholic. Provided that one godparent is a Catholic who meets the requirements, the other may be filled in by a non-Catholic Christian who is baptized. This person is known as a Christian witness, but essentially fills in the role of the second godparent.

Turning a Resolution into a Discipline

As we begin our new year, often resolutions play a part in our plans for the future. We want to lose weight, change our daily routine, get into better shape, etc. Even my Apple Watch recently presented me with a New Year's exercise challenge.

New Year's resolutions, at least in my experience, are often short-lived. These decisions are usually made during the holidays,

based on emotion or a reality check such as stepping on the scales. Unfortunately, they may last a few weeks or maybe a month.

Webster defines a resolution as a "decision or determination" about something. It is a choice we made and, obviously, we can change our minds. The key this time of year is to turn a resolution into a discipline. A discipline involves building a regimen - a regular course of action - that becomes an integral part of your life. The key is that you build discipline,

it doesn't just happen. Discipline is based on continuing resolution, not just the initial decision. Each morning, for example, you have to resolve to stay on your eating or exercise plan. Even when you don't feel like it, you mount the treadmill, push "start," and stay the allotted amount of time.

 If you want to turn a resolution into a discipline, there are basically three steps to follow... three D's: Decide, Dedicate, Do. First, you need to make your initial resolution, deciding what it is you want to accomplish. A decision should be based on what you want to accomplish and the end result. Second, you have to dedicate yourself - regularly... daily - to the process for accomplishing the goal and, finally, you have to do it. The decision part is easy, the dedication part a little more difficult but the "doing" is the tough part. As you continue to follow your plan, it establishes itself as a discipline in your life that becomes a part of what you normally do. As a priest and pastor, one of my key concerns for all of us is our spiritual disciplines. There are several of them we could look at, including simplicity of life, solitude, confession and worship

(Mass). As we begin our new year, I'd like to really encourage you to make a resolution or strengthen your resolution regarding the personal disciplines of a daily time for the Scriptures and prayer. These two disciplines refresh the heart daily in marvelous ways.

For Scriptures, as wonderful as our pre-arranged devotional aids can be, nothing is more better, in my estimation, than doing your reading in the Bible. It puts your reading in context and gives you a greater understanding on how everything fits together. There are plans you can find online to help you read through the Bible in a year. You can also simply choose one of the books to begin. I recommend starting in the New Testament. For a gospel, begin with John. You can also read one of Paul's letters - particularly Romans or his prison epistles of Galatians, Ephesians, Philippians or Colos-

sians. If you want a recommendation for a good Bible to read devotionally and for study, I would have you look at "The Ignatius Catholic Study Bible: New Testament."

There are many different ways to pray on a daily basis. You can pray, using the Bible reading you are undertaking through "Lectio Divina." You can use a prayer book or one of the several devotional resources available. One of my favorites is "Magnificat." You can also simply set an approach to prayer using such things as the morning offering, and spontaneous prayer, writing in a journal, or having a prayer list.

I want to strongly encourage you to make a resolution to begin or reinforce your heart devotionally and then to take it from being a resolution to a discipline.
