From the Pope's Pulpit



Among the vulnerable for whom the Church wishes to care with particular love and concern are unborn children, the most defenseless and innocent among us. Nowadays

efforts are made to deny them their human dignity and to do with them whatever one pleases, taking their lives and passing laws preventing anyone from standing in the way of this. Frequently, as a way of ridiculing the Church's effort to defend their lives, attempts are made to present her position as ideological, obscurantist and conservative. Yet this defense of unborn life is closely linked to the defense of each and every other human right. Precisely because this involves the internal consistency of our message about the value of the human person, the Church cannot be expected to change her position on this question. I want to be completely honest in this regard. This is not something subject to alleged reforms or "modernizations". It is not "progressive" to try to resolve problems by eliminating a human life.

From the Pastor's Pen

My thanks to everyone who participated in our annual vigil of life. I am grateful for your support in the deeply important work of building what St. John



Paul II called a *culture of life*. Our starting point is with what is right about human life-that it is made in the image and likeness of God with a dignity that is always to be respected. When we see what is right, what the values are, we can then more clearly see what is wrong, what the anti-values are. There are four building blocks to a culture of life: legal advocacy, direct assistance to those in need, education and underlying all this, is prayer. Respecting human life in all it forms, born and unborn, is not about imposing a religious agenda. It is about civil rights. It is about human rights. Like racism, and so much other evil, disrespect of human life can become embedded into a sinful structure and into legal systems where what is wrong is taken for right and those who question it are considered troublemakers or worse.
