

Dear Parishioners,

This last week on January 4 we celebrated the feast of St. Elizabeth Ann Seton. Her life teaches us a simple but profound truth: the evil and chaos of the world does not stop us from doing good in the world.

Here are some facts about her life. She lived 47 years from 1774 to 1821. This meant that St. Elizabeth lived during the American Revolution, French Revolution, and the War of 1812. This meant that much of Europe and the new world where she lived saw violence, political unrest, and much fear of what the future would hold. She also lived during the time of epidemics including the tuberculosis epidemic that claimed her husband's life in Italy.

She had every reason not to love life. But God revealed his love to her and she received that love. In receiving that love from Jesus, she became a person for others. She did not let the evil of the world prevent her from doing the good that God had called her.

She became the founder of a religious order, she was a mother, and a servant of the immigrant and the poor. She was a part of the founding and establishing of the Catholic school system in the United States. She did the good God called her to and she wasn't going to let war, violence, political unrest, or pandemics prevent her from living holiness.

I think there is a lesson for us in St. Elizabeth's life. There are so many people who feel powerless in the face of the evil of the world. Her life teaches us no matter what is happening in the world, we can do the good God has called us to. We can love sacrificially in our lives. We can live the truth despite the errors in the world.

The craziness of the world does not have to rob us of the desire to make the world better. In fact it should be our motivation to make the world better.

May God bless you in this New Year of 2022!

GOSPEL MEDITATION

"We are called to live our baptism every day, as new creatures, clothed in Christ." — Pope Francis

What reference point do you use when making decisions? Many times, impulse takes control and decisions are made based solely on emotion and desire. We all know that these types of decisions can often get us into trouble. When a person has a confident sense of who they are and a real understanding of what is important and of value, the likelihood of kneejerk impulsive choices diminishes. Baptism gives us what we need to make well informed and purposeful decisions. By this simple gesture, God claims us as His own and provides us with the identity and purpose we need to properly live life.

It is tremendously reassuring, when we truly embrace this revelation and realize that we no longer have to wonder about the purpose of our lives or struggle to find our way. The answer of who we are in God has been given to us. We no longer have to fumble around, trip over ourselves or walk aimlessly about. Issues surrounding the sacredness of life, the meaning of death, the protection of those most vulnerable, care for the weak and the poor, offering hospitality to those in search of a home, the purpose and proper place of work, how to create a just social order, caring for creation, and understanding our roles as heralds and stewards are just a few of the wonderful gifts baptism brings. When we make decisions based on things such as these core Gospel truths we really act as Christ himself, revealing to others the new creations that we are. This is how we live our baptism.

It is difficult to walk against the tide. Yet, that is precisely what baptism calls us to do. Although we are sinners, in need of mercy and far from perfection we are called to order our life and make decisions based upon the wisdom and guidance of Almighty God. He alone is the one who can claim us as His sons and daughters. Standing up for our principles will not make us popular. But who ever said Christianity is a popularity contest? Baptism calls us to stand up for that which goes against the grain of secularism. Standing in line with other sinners, we have our anchor to steady us in the


