*The Assumption of the
Blessed Virgin Mary*

the Quill and the Cloth

“While Jesus was speaking, a woman from the crowd called out and said to Him, “Blessed is the womb that carried you and the breasts at which you nursed.” He replied, “Rather, blessed are those who hear the word of God and observe it.”

-St. Luke



In these three lines is the entire Gospel passage for the Vigil Mass for the Feast of the Assumption. Amazing! And in these three lines, a woman shouts out to Jesus a blessing and a compliment to the mother that raised Him, namely the Blessed Mother.

I suppose that all of you have heard why we should never *assume* anything. So let us not *assume* that we know everything there is to know about the Assumption of Mary.

I have read numerous authors who indicate that Mary's Assumption into heaven is the result of her holy life. In short, there are many who claim that the Assumption is the reward for her supreme role in salvation history, as well as her reward for living a supreme spiritual life here on this earth. If you are thinking along these lines, you might be *assuming* too much when it comes to Mary's Assumption.

St. John of the Cross, a Spanish saint and mystic who lived in the 1500's, once wrote: ***“...A Christian should always remember that the value of his good works is not based on their number or their excellence, but on the love of God which prompts him (or her) to do these things.”***

Although the Blessed Mother had free will and could have refused at the Annunciation to be the Mother of God; she freely chose to take on this noble work because of the love she had for God already in her heart. ***But the love Mary had for God was already a gift to her from God.*** Yes, it is true that Mary was “full of grace,” but the spiritual gift of grace was given to her by God. My point is this (in keeping with the writings of St. John of the Cross): **Mary did not so much receive the great gift of the Assumption because of her MATERNAL LOVE for Jesus. Mary received the gift of the Assumption because of the MESSIANIC LOVE Jesus had for her.**

How many times we get gift giving wrong. If we give a gift, we expect a gift in return. If we give a gift of money, we expect at least a thank you in return either verbally or in written form. But giving in its purest form is giving with no expectation in return. We give purely out of love, and expect nothing in return. The Assumption of Mary is gift giving in its most perfect sense on both sides. Mary gave freely out of a love for God that God had given to her. Mary used that perfect gift of maternal love as the Mother of God, loving her Divine Son to the point of standing under the Cross of Calvary, at great personal risk to her own life. God saw how beautifully she used the gifts he had given to her and in turn, because she was such a wonderful steward of the first gift of a life of love and grace, He gave to her an even greater gift of taking her both body and soul into heaven through the Assumption.

The Feast of the Assumption of Mary is a good model to lay alongside our own life, as we trace Mary's life against our own. How has God's love and grace been used in our life? Are we utilizing our Baptism to the full extent of grace that this sacrament contains, much less all of the other sacraments we receive? Do you believe that you are living your life right now in a spirit that is “full of grace,” or rather is life right now just filled with lots of “get up and go,” and the busyness of life? As the Lord looks at our life right now, do you believe that He sees you using your life to its full spiritual potential? Would God want to extend to you another great gift of grace beyond this life with everlasting life of both body and soul through your own assumption one day?

The closing line of this short little passage is most revealing and spiritually challenging. St. Luke reminds us through the words of our Lord that even more important than family loyalty and love, is our loyalty and love for the faith. Recall again the words of the Lord, ***“...Rather, blessed are those who hear the word of God and observe it.”*** See you at Mass! I hope to see you next Wednesday at our final Wednesday outdoor Mass at the Kolstad's! God love you!

In talking with other pastors, we are seeing a gradual increase (*at least in Catholic churches*) of people participating in the weekend experience of attending Mass. Last weekend was a much stronger attendance at the three Masses, but we are still a little ways away from pre-Covid attendance.

One wise parishioner reminded me that once school is in session, summer travel will begin to slow down and attendance from our younger families should pick up. Right now, folks are getting in the last weekends to run, which is understandable. It might be a good time right now to review your stewardship giving. Sometimes, you might be amazed at how much you have given to your church but you also might be amazed at how you might improve your giving. As always, thank you for your gifts.



As we complete almost a sixth of the new stewardship year, we have seen no movement in this *Stewardship Corner*, as we might have seen in other years. In previous years, we were noticeably above budget, while this year we just slightly under budget at this time. We have paired down our repairs and improvements, given all the work that we have completed on the interior sanctuary this past year as well as the new air-conditioning system for the church that has worked like a charm this summer. I believe that this has been one of the hottest summers in my memory. I cannot remember a time where we ran the air-conditioning in the rectory as well as the church week in and week out with no break. And of course, that all costs additional stewardship through the utilities.

This summer you may have noticed that we have resurfaced the parking area in the alley on the south side of church. The crew did a very good job, but this set us back in stewardship by \$2,500.00. We also had to repair the handicapped door and glass addition that was sinking into the ground due to unstable footings. This cost was first bid out at some \$20,000.00. We sought another bid that came in at \$5,000.00. When the crew finally did the work, the Good News is that the foundation was not as compromised as we had first thought. So, the final cost came down to \$3,678.00.

I had said to Jim, our administrator, that I did not foresee any repairs or improvements that would be needed for the rectory as we were preparing the budget for the new fiscal year. But no sooner than you say it, then something breaks. This week I noticed a small leak by the water heater in the basement. The plumber confirmed my suspicions and the water heater had

rusted out after only some seven and a half years. It was installed shortly before my arrival some seven years ago in 2014. But some \$1,300.00 later, it is all working once again and free of leaks.

So if I had to write a report on what I did as pastor during my summer vacation, there would be a chapter entitled "Repairs". The total cost of these repairs or improvements that I just mentioned this summer came to a total of about \$7,500.00. Is there anyone out there who is reading this and in a generous stewardship mood? As always, thank you for your gifts!


