# **September 24, 2023** 25th Sunday in Ordinary Time

"And on receiving it, they grumbled against the landowner, saying, 'These last ones worked only one hour, and you have made them equal to us, who bore the day's burden and the heat."" - St. Matthew



It is so unfair!" How many times have we heard these four words said, to us, or we have said them ourselves? Yet, the vast majority of the time that those words are spoken, they are not spoken on behalf of the benefit of others, but rather on behalf

of the benefit of ourselves. For we tend to claim that something or someone is being "UNFAIR" when it affects us. Suffice it to say, when we exclaim something is "UNFAIR", it is usually a spiritual statement of selfishness!

A spiritual hero, in terms of "fairness" is of course, the person who is seeking "justice" or "equality", not for the benefit of themselves, but rather for the benefit of another. Certainly in the secular world this could be seen through the example of a lawyer, who is working for justice for a client, and does it "pro bono". Perhaps a spiritual hero of "fairness" might be the police officer who works off duty for "fairness", to purchase for a teenager [who is not even a member of his family] a new bicycle since the teen's bike had been stolen without a trace. And the list goes on of those many unsung heroes who are trying to make right and "FAIR" for others what has been wronged.

But since we were little and our parents presented us with a piece of cake, as we gazed at our fellow siblings and saw that their piece was slighter larger than ours; we said those four immortal words, "IT IS NOT FAIR"! When we arrived in school and were the last one's picked for the team or were not chosen to be the lead in the school play, we again cried out, "IT IS NOT FAIR"! When we were passed over for that job promotion, or a marriage failed, or a loved one died before their time, or it simply rained on a day you wanted to be out and about, we again say, "IT IS NOT FAIR"!

And as it is in the physical order, so too in the spiritual order as well. There are many in the Church today who consider it unfair that women cannot be priests, priests cannot enter into marriage, same-sex attracted people cannot be accepted in the lifestyle they have chosen, and the list goes on, and on, and on! There are those out there who will boldly state, "IF GOD IS SUCH A GOD OF JUSTICE, THEN WHY DOES HE ALLOW SO MUCH INJUSTICE TO EXIST IN HIS CHURCH?"

But consider this! When we were young, our parents made decisions for us that we thought were "UNFAIR" [according to our young brains] but as we aged and matured, we came to discover that what our young minds perceived as "UNFAIR", was in fact, very "FAIR"! So, too in the case of God our Father. We may wonder why God took a loved one away from us leaving us alone as a widower or a widow? We may wonder why sickness has come to us when we have tried to take good care of our health? We may wonder why a storm destroyed our home when we practice the faith while a neighbor who does not practice the faith, only has a small branch laying on their lawn?

Today's Gospel parable about the landowner who owns a vineyard and hires workers throughout the course of a day to work in his vineyard is a parable all about the problem of "FAIRNESS". For at the end of the day, the landowner of the vineyard gives all of the workers the same salary, even though some have worked a full day in the sun whereas others have worked only an hour. But recall the words of the landowner to those who worked all day and cried out "UNFAIR"! "MY FRIEND, I AM NOT CHEATING YOU. DID YOU NOT AGREE WITH ME FOR THE USUAL DAILY WAGE? TAKE WHAT IS YOURS AND GO! WHAT IF I WISH TO GIVE THIS LAST ONE THE SAME AS YOU?... ARE YOU ENVIOUS BECAUSE I AM GENEROUS?"

Of course, some scripture scholars argue that this is an eschatological gospel; meaning that this gospel is addressing the issues of the end of times, such as the final judgment. Specifically, suppose we have practiced the faith all our lives, given generously of our time, talent, and treasure, and have been perfect models of Christ to everyone we have met in our lives. On the other hand, in comparison, someone who has never gone to church, never given a dime, or done much of anything for anyone, but on their deathbed, they call for a priest, make a perfect confession, and profess their belief in Christ as their Lord and Savior. According to the Church, both will be given the reward of everlasting life. Will you stand at the throne of judgment, you who have been faithful, alongside the one who was largely unfaithful, and cry out, "THIS IS SO UNFAIR GOD!" Maybe "Yes"? Maybe "No"?

In an age where we are always crying for "FAIRNESS", the Church teaches that above fairness or justice, is mercy and love. The landowner [who represents God the Father] does not give a full day's salary to those who only worked an hour out of justice, as much as he gave it out of GENEROSITY, MERCY, AND LOVE. In the week ahead, instead of instinctively crying out with little or no forethought, "IT IS SO UNFAIR"; instead, maybe in the spirit of our Catholic faith we should cry out, "IT IS SO MERCIFUL", or even, "THAT WAS SO LOVING". May the week ahead be less about "FAIRNESS" or even "JUSTICE" and more about "MERCY" and "LOVE". Have a good week. See you at Mass!

We again are making some steady progress on our MAJOR project of renovating and renewing our social hall, kitchen, and restrooms after some 75 years. Many thanks to all of you who continue to relentlessly contribute towards this major designated fund.

This week we were able to take another 1% forward of the monies needed for the social hall project. For this week we went from a grand total of \$633,965.00 to \$640,915.00, or the increased dollar amount of \$6,950.00. Some of this money had accrued from your weekly donations, but the lion's share was from some additional monies the parish received from the Sunday collections that we felt we could spare and could go into the designated fund. So, we moved now from 79% to the new benchmark of a cool 80%. We are now definitely more than halfway down the mountain of stewardship as we continue to raise the last 20% of the amount needed.

As I stated last week, the front doors of the church have FINALLY arrived and will be installed when the exterior hardware and locks arrive, which we were told would take about a week to ten days. This week the interior of the doors is wood and will be stained and varnished in the same color and style as the present church's wood interior. As I am writing this to you, I have just been informed that the lower church windows which have been leaking and causing a good portion of the plaster damage on the social hall walls, will be replaced beginning this past Friday and the project should be completed before the close of September. [We had been told by the company that these windows were going to be installed in early August! But, better *late than never! Right?*]

Finally, I had a meeting this past Tuesday with a representative from the carpet company as well as a staff member of Rickway Carpeting here in North

Mankato. I believe the company is Mohawk Carpeting. The fellow from South Dakota, named "Mike", was the carpet representative. Apparently, his sole job is to review defective products, bad installation, etc. He could quite easily pull up the carpeting that had been glued down. He stated that the carpet squares tend to curl up where people have walked more and that is why he claimed it had come up so much towards the back of the church. But then I pointed out that the choir loft also has a lot of carpet squares coming up and no one has been there with any regularity. Upon inspection, he told us that the company is having trouble with their rubber backed carpets and are switching to a linen backing. He told the Rickway staff member that when the new carpet was ordered it would have the new linen backing. In the end, the GOOD NEWS is that the aisles will be recarpeted all again with new carpet of the same color and quality, and at NO expense to the parish either for materials or labor! The only issue is that the parish will have to go through the hassle of closing the church down for several days to complete the work. The carpet will arrive in October. The plans are to install the carpeting on the week of November 12th, immediately after the Fall Festival beginning on Monday morning at 10:00 a.m. And so it goes!


