This weekend's challenging Gospel for the 8th Sunday in Ordinary Time, is a *perfect* lead in for what will be taking place spiritually this Wednesday! **WHAT IS HAPPENING THIS WEDNESDAY, YOU ASK?** Well, I am glad that you asked! For if you are not already aware, this Wednesday is the start of the Lenten season with the celebration of Ash Wednesday on March 5th!

I know! I know! We have neither the enthusiasm nor the excitement for Ash Wednesday, as we might have for Christmas, Thanksgiving, or Easter. For on those special occasions we usually look forward to gathering with family and friends and being close with the people that we love. But in reality, that is what Ash Wednesday and the Lenten season is all about as well. For is not Ash Wednesday really an occasion that we should look forward to, to spiritually gather with our family of faith and to draw ourselves closer through prayer, fasting, and almsgiving with our God who is LOVE?

Speaking of LOVE, I love the definition of Lent being a "SPIRITUAL RESET". For Lent is a perfect time to **RESET RELIGIOUSLY** our life of faith that may have faltered over the past year when it comes to **PRAYING** as we should, through daily prayer and weekly/daily Eucharist; **FASTING**, from the foods and behaviors that we do not need and **HAVING MADE MANY UNHEALTHY CHOICES** both physically and spiritually; and finally **GIVING**, to the Church and to other charities, as we tend to drift away from giving to others and mostly to ourselves so often throughout the year.

How often through the year do we do "physical resets"? For many of us go each year to the doctor to have a "physical", or a physical exam. Our family physician

ends up checking our body out from head to foot, poking and prodding in that annual exam. And at the conclusion of the exam he/she may tell us that we need to **reset our diet**. We reset our diet, of course, by eating less, or maybe eating less salt and fat. The doctor may ask us again to **"reset" this idea of resting** in the evenings on the couch by instead getting up and doing some exercise. Each year, a time or two **we RESET, reluctantly, the reality of having our teeth checked out**. And as we arrive in the dentist's office, we are really not that keen or care to hear the sound of the spinning of a drill in an exam room down the hallway. But we do the dentist thing, because we believe that a healthy mouth is the gateway to a healthy body.

In this weekend's Gospel, the holy scriptures focus on the spiritual fact of **HYPOCRISY**. We all know what **HYPOCRISY IS, RIGHT?** Hypocrisy is of course saying one thing but doing another. Do as I say but not as I do. And just as a dentist might find a cavity in our mouth that needs to be drilled and filled in, so too when out of our mouths come the spiritual decay of hypocrisy, and out of our minds and bodies comes the spiritual decay or destruction of sin, it too makes good sense in terms of our spiritual health, to have these 40 days to change our ways and our very lives in order that we will be able to get to heaven some day!

I would ask that right now you might start to prepare for the great spiritual celebration of Ash Wednesday. For just as we prepare for Christmas by putting up the nativity scene or the Christmas tree, how about right now as you are reading this article, you might reflect not only on what you are going to give up this Lent, but also to ponder on what you are going to possibly do this Lent? Pastorally, I intend to do several things and one of them is to pray more for the Church and our local church of Holy Rosary. I intend to pray that they might prioritize that perfect prayer of the Mass above all else each weekend.

Most of all, may we pray in this Lent of 2025, and in this 100th Anniversary of our parish of Holy Rosary, that we will see this as the perfect time to "REPENT AND BELIEVE IN THE GOSPEL", IN ORDER TO CELEBRATE THE HOLY EUCHARIST WITH PRAISE AND THANKSGIVING ON SUNDAY, APRIL 20TH, 2025!

See you this Wednesday! Have a good week and great Lent of **renewal** through the **resetting** of your **religious life**.

Stewardship of Gratitude

Cold hands but a warm heart! Even though our weather has been quite cold and has even affected our stewardship of time in attending Mass, your stewardship of treasure continues. Thank you for your gifts! We are of course standing on the threshold of another **Lenten season that is only 3 days away, on Wednesday, March 5th!** It is a perfect time to reset our religious practices and a time to reset our regular priorities.

PRAY! FAST! GIVE! These are the three spiritual calls during the Lenten season! For some of us we might consider resetting our prayer life by getting back into the groove by attending Mass each weekend as a family. Perhaps our family has grown up and are gone, and we are retired. This might be a perfect time to reset our prayer life and to come a time or two each week to celebrate the perfect prayer called the Mass.

FASTING! We are now being told by the medical community that fasting not only has spiritual benefits but also health benefits. Many people are now fasting [*as was done years ago*] from midnight or earlier for 12 hours, before receiving the Holy Eucharist. Doctors are now saying it is not only good giving our digestive track a rest. 80% of all Americans are now overweight or obese. Over 16% of American children are overweight and 1 in 3 adolescents are now pre-diabetic. Perhaps the old-fashioned abstinence of candy and sweets for our young people would be a wise thing to embrace once again not only for spiritual reasons but also for physical reasons.

GIVING! Many of us grew up in homes where it was expected that we would give! We were expected to give of ourselves to do chores and help around the house. Each week when we went to Mass, we gave our beautiful dime that we wished we could keep for ourselves. Did you know that it has been proven scientifically, if not spiritually, of the goodness of giving? Did you know that generous giving of our time and treasure can improve your mood, reduce stress, raise self-esteem and even help you live longer? As always, thank you for your giving!

We begin the Lenten season not only for the people of our parish but also for the pupils that are participating in our Faith Formation program here at Holy Rosary. 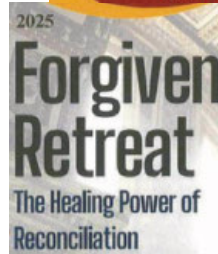
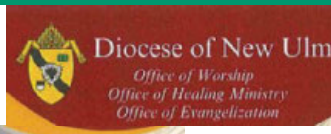

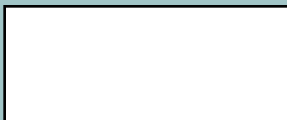
