MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

THE HOLY FAMILY OF JESUS, MARY AND JOSEPH

In this season marked by family gatherings, it is appropriate that we celebrate today the Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph. When God the Son, the second person of the Blessed Trinity, became incarnate in human flesh, he became a member of a human family and of the

human family. God entrusted to the care of Mary and Joseph his divine Son, just as he entrusts to the care of their parents all children born into this world. Since all of us are children of God, parents should receive and nurture their children with the same reverence and love with which Mary and Joseph cared for Jesus. Likewise, children should obey and love their parents as Jesus was obedient to Mary and Joseph.

Saturday, on New Year's Day, we celebrate the second of the three solemnities of the Christmas season: the Solemnity of Mary, the Holy Mother of God. Without Mary's cooperation, God's plan for our salvation could not have come to completion. On this day we express our debt of gratitude to Mary, whose response to God was: "Behold I am the handmaid of the Lord; let it be done to me according to your word." Because it falls on Saturday this year, this solemnity is not a holy day of obligation. Nevertheless, it is a day worth celebrating and beginning the new year with Mass. There will be Mass at St. Charles Friday evening at 5:30 and Saturday morning at 10:30; and at St. Peter on Friday evening at 7:00.

For 55 years January 1 has been observed by Catholics, at least, as the World Day of Peace. The text of Pope Francis' message for the 55th annual World Day of Peace was not yet available as of this writing, but this year's theme is, "Education, Work and Dialogue between Generations: Tools for Building Lasting Peace." The Dicastery for Promoting Integral Human Development reports that "Pope Francis thus identifies three vast contexts today in full mutation, to propose an innovative reading that responds to the needs of current and future times, inviting everyone 'to read the signs of the times with the eyes of faith,' so that the direction of this change awakens new and old questions with which it is right and necessary to be confronted." I'm not sure what that means or where this is going, so I guess we'll just have to wait for the document to be published. On this Holy Family Sunday it seems appropriate that "dialogue between generations" is a family theme. For now, let us recall this excerpt from last year's message: "Educating people to care begins in the *family*, the natural and fundamental nucleus of society, in which we learn how to live and relate to others in a spirit of mutual respect."

Father Hokamp and I wish to thank all who remembered us with prayers, cards, gifts, homemade treats and wines this Christmas. It is always heartwarming to know how much our ministry means to you. Unfortunately we as a parish were not permitted to take cookies to homebound parishioners again this year, but maybe you were able to drop something off for a neighbor who is homebound. Let us pray for all who have been isolated in their homes or care centers during another difficult year.

Enjoy these holy holidays to whatever extent you are gathering with family and friends. Pray for the safety of all who are traveling during these days. Remember those who are prevented from seeing others because of the pandemic, and others who are far from home, especially those serving overseas.

May God bless us all throughout the coming year.

Hello everyone. I just wanted to take a moment to thank you all for intentionally forming yourself around the amazing mysteries practiced and expressed in this

tradition we call the Faith. Whether you've been enrolling you children in Religious Education, sending them to MACS, DTS, prepping them for the reception of the sacraments, or have participated yourselves in the different adult formation opportunities we've offered such as Connect, or simply faithfully participating in Mass every week, thank you.

As we moved through Advent toward our Lord's incarnation at Christmas, I've been struck this season at the importance of Logos in a world that seems to have lost nearly any sense of meaning. This Logos, the Word of God, fully expressed in Christ, and brought to us in our Tradition and Liturgy, which finds its focal point in the Body and Blood of Christ, fills the world and our own lives with meaning. Getting our heads around this can be difficult as it calls us to see and participate in the world in a manner that is simply not intuitive to our modern minds. Learning to see the world this way is a long, slow, and difficult process that requires help and community; it's not like flipping the lights on. Nor is it an individual process. I'm grateful to be a part of this community we call St. Charles and St. Peter. I'm grateful for your commitment to this Faith and to passing it on to your children through the various programs we offer here. I'm increasingly convinced that this is the only hope for our world as things seem to fall apart. My prayer for our world is that everything we're going through as a culture is God tilling the soil, which is a profoundly destructive act, so that the seed of hope, the *Logos*, can take new root.

Who is a parishioner?

One who is registered and regularly participates in the liturgical life of the parish and demonstrates support of the parish mission by completing and fulfilling an annual commitment of time, treasure and talent.

To register in the Parish: We welcome anyone interested in being an active member of our parish. Please call the parish office (715-723-4088) and make an appointment with Msgr. Gorman.
