MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

YOU ARE MY BELOVED SON

The Christmas season concludes today with the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. As narrated in today's Gospel, God the Father himself attests that he whose birth we have been celebrating is in fact God the Son become man. We have heard this truth announced by angels to shepherds, signified to the Magi by a star and heralded by John the Baptist.

Jesus' baptism was to mark the beginning of his public ministry. Incorporated into Christ and into the Church through our baptism, we too are God's beloved and are commissioned to proclaim the Good News with our lives.

St. Hippolytus, a third-century priest and martyr, reflects with amazement on the fact that Jesus should be baptized by John the Baptist. At the same time he does not want us to miss the significance of our baptism. Here are some excerpts of his sermon on the Epiphany.

The Father of immortality sent his immortal Son and Word into the world; he came to us men to cleanse us with water and the Spirit... Let peoples of every nation come and receive the immortality that flows from baptism. This is the water that is linked to the Spirit, the water that irrigates Paradise...this is the water by which a man receives new birth and life, the water in which even Christ was baptized, the water into which the Holy Spirit descended in the form of a dove...Whoever goes down into these waters of rebirth with faith renounces the devil and pledges himself to Christ. He repudiates the enemy and confesses that Christ is God, throws off his servitude, and is raised to filial status. He comes up from baptism resplendent as the sun, radiant in his purity, but above all, he comes as a son of God, and a coheir with Christ.

Jesus' baptism would mark the beginning of his public ministry. The baptism we received is the baptism with the Holy Spirit that John predicted would succeed his baptism of repentance. (Gospel) It is through this baptism that we became God's children by adoption, "born not by natural generation nor by human choice nor by a man's decision but of God." (John 1:13) From this flows our ministry as members of the Body of Christ: "Go into the whole world and proclaim the gospel to every creature." (Mark 16:15)

With the conclusion today of the liturgical season of Christmas, we begin tomorrow the liturgical season of Ordinary Time. This season does not celebrate any particular aspect of the Paschal Mystery as do all the other seasons of the liturgical year. Rather, Ordinary Time is characterized by an ordered reading of the gospels—the meaning behind the name. On weekdays we begin with the gospel of Mark, then Matthew in the summer and Luke in the fall. On Sundays this year we follow the gospel of Luke, after a transitionary passage from John's gospel next Sunday. The First Readings on weekdays are ordered readings from the other books of the bible, alternating between the books of the Old Testament and the epistles of the New Testament. On Sundays the First Readings are from the Old Testament and correspond in some way to the Gospel of the day, while the Second Readings are ordered readings from the epistles of the New Testament with no particular relationship to the First Reading or the Gospel.

Pray the rosary this week for people lacking shelter from winter's cold, whether in our own community, or those who have lost everything due to the derecho from Arkansas to Kentucky or the wildfires in Colorado; and, as always, pray for peace.

May God bless his people with peace. Monsignor Gorman





Happy New Year from the seventh and eighth grades. Our Christmas vacation left us refreshed and ready to dive into a new year. The students began the year thinking about their goals for 2022.

In Religion class, they read *The History of St. Peter School-Tilden, a short history as told by Mrs. Cathy Bohl. They learned some interesting facts about our school!* During math time, algebra students wrapped up a chapter in which they learned about graphs and functions. Next up: linear equations. Prealgebra students are nearing the end of their math chapter learning about solving equations with fractions.

During science class, the students began a chapter about electrical charges and static electricity. They've experimented with electrical attraction and repulsion and have a better understanding of static electricity.

The "Festival of Nations" has become a hot topic in the classroom. This week the students started the project by choosing the country they'd like to learn more about. In Reading and Language Arts, the students have been busy. In reading class, the students began the novel *Cheaper By the Dozen*, based on a family of 12 children that lived in the early 1900s. In Language Arts, identifying adverb clauses has been challenging the students.

Finally, the fifth-eighth grade students began preparing for the Scripps National Spelling Bee. So far they have taken a written test and participated in an oral bee in each of their classrooms. Next, the top spellers will compete to be the top school speller and will then compete at the regional level. Wish them luck!

One who is registered and regularly participates in the liturgical life of the parish and demonstrates support of the parish mission by completing and fulfilling an annual commitment of time, treasure and talent.

To register in the Parish: We welcome anyone interested in being an active member of our parish. Please call the parish office (715-723-4088) and make an appointment with Msgr. Gorman.

Baptisms: First-time parents must attend an instruction class, which is held every three months. Parents are encouraged to plan ahead and attend the class prior to the birth of their child. Please contact the parish office to sign up for the class.

Marriages: Couples are required to contact Father at least six months prior to the anticipated wedding date and BEFORE making any other arrangements or reserving a reception hall.

Anointing of the Sick: If you would like to receive the Sacrament of the Sick, please see Father after Mass. The sacrament is available to all who are ailing physically, mentally or spiritually.

Hospitalized/Homebound: If you are in the hospital or homebound and would like to receive Holy Communion, please contact the parish office.

Phone or Address Change: Please contact the parish office if you no longer have a landline phone, moved and have a new address.

Bulletin Deadline: Please have all information to the office by Friday noon, one week before the date printed in the bulletin or two weeks before a holiday bulletin.
