MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

YOUR WORDS, LORD, ARE SPIRIT AND LIFE

Today's First Reading describes an ancient "Liturgy of the Word." As Ezra prepared to read from the scroll of the Law—the most sacred part of the Old Testament scriptures—he held it up for all to see and the people rose out of respect. As he blessed God they replied with an acclamation, "Amen, amen!" As Ezra read from God's word, he also explained it. This parallels the proclamation

of the gospel—the most sacred part of the New Testament scriptures—at Mass. The *Book of Gospels* is held up and carried in procession while the congregation stands out of respect. "Alleluia" is our acclamation along with "Glory to you, O Lord" and "Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ." Once God's word is proclaimed, it is also explained.

Today we begin a more-or-less continuous reading of the Gospel according to Luke, the primary gospel for this year's Sunday readings. Today's Gospel begins with an introduction which is dedicated to a certain Theophilus. It is possible that Theophilus was a benefactor who had commissioned Luke's work. The name Theophilus (Θεόφιλος) means "friend of God." Is it not also possible that it is dedicated to each of us who are friends of God?

After this introduction we jump ahead three chapters to the beginning of Jesus' public ministry. Here Jesus applies a passage from Isaiah to himself, affirming that he is the Christ—that is, the Lord's anointed. Having celebrated the Christmas mystery as the birth of the Messiah, we now begin to reflect upon what this means by listening to the accounts of his ministry and of his preaching.

The Spirit of God is emphasized in the writings of Luke. The Spirit of God is also emphasized in today's Second Reading, as Paul reminds us that "in one Spirit we were all baptized into one body...and we were all given to drink of one Spirit." In this one Spirit, received in baptism and confirmation, we become truly "Christians"—that is, anointed ones.

The annual Week of Prayer for Christian Unity concludes this Tuesday, January 25, the Feast of the Conversion of Saint Paul. This year's theme is: "We Saw the Star in the East, and We Came To Worship Him." This is the explanation of the theme: "Like the Magi who braved the perils of a long and dangerous journey to find the Christ child, our Christian brothers and sisters in the Middle East face many hardships as they strive to live out their faith in Christ. Our prayer in solidarity with their suffering is a light of hope and communion."

On September 30, 2019, in a *motu proprio* entitled *Aperuit illis*, Pope Francis designated the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time—that is this Sunday—as the Sunday of the Word of God. The timing of the document is significant: September 30 is the memorial of Saint Jerome, the man who translated most of the Bible into Latin, and who famously said, "Ignorance of Scripture is ignorance of Christ." The title of the document, *Aperuit illis*, is equally important. They are its opening words, taken from St. Luke's Gospel, where the Evangelist describes how the Risen Jesus appeared to His disciples, and how "He opened their minds to understand the Scriptures."

Catholics are often accused of being unfamiliar with the Bible. In reality Catholics should be more familiar with the Bible than any Christians for a number of reasons. First of all, the Catholic Church assembled the Bible as we know it today, determining which writings should be included as the inspired word of God. Secondly, so much of the Bible is proclaimed during the Mass in the course of the liturgical year, with a three-year cycle of readings on Sundays and a two-year cycle on weekdays. Finally, we have two thousand years' worth of commentaries which reflect the living tradition of the Church from the first Christian century down to the present day. If Catholics are not familiar with the Bible, it's our own fault!

Remember that this weekend we are taking up a second collection for people affected by recent storms affecting neighbors in Stanley and fellow citizens to our south and in Colorado. Whatever is collected will be divided 30% to Stanley and 70% to Catholic Charities USA. Any checks should be made payable to your parish.

Pray the Rosary this week for an end to legalized abortion and the many other crimes against human life and dignity, for the unity of Christians, for people affected by natural disasters and, as always, pray for peace.

May God bless his people with peace. Monsignor Gorman




