MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

YOU HAVE CHANGED MY MOURNING INTO DANCING

This verse from today's Responsorial Psalm expresses the effect of the Easter mystery on our lives. Mourning is related to death; dancing is a celebration of the joy of living. In the resurrection of Jesus life triumphs over death, joy over grief, love over fear. In today's Gospel Peter, who had denied the Lord three times out of fear, professes his love for Jesus Monsignor three times. The Apostle John says, "There is no fear in love, but perfect Michael J. Gorman love drives out fear." (1 John 4:18) In last Sunday's Gospel we heard.



"The disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord." Today's First Reading demonstrates the fearless love of the apostles who not only do not back down when questioned by the Sanhedrin who had succeeded in having Jesus crucified, but they leave "rejoicing that they had been found worthy to suffer dishonor for the sake of the name [of Jesus]."

Peter's profession of love for Jesus in today's Gospel entails a responsibility. He who had called himself the Good Shepherd (cf. John 10:11) now entrusts his flock to Peter: "Feed my lambs; feed my sheep." Then he who had died and was now raised tells Peter that he, too, shall be put to death; but that by his death "he would glorify God." Love will again triumph over fear, life over death.

This great season of grace continues next week as second graders from St. Peter Parish will receive their First Holy Communion during the 9:00 Mass next Sunday, May 8. Confirmation will be conferred upon young people from both parishes next Sunday afternoon, at St. Charles Church, at 1:00. The Church is enriched and renewed by the grace of these sacraments effective in the lives of her members.

This Monday we will celebrate the feast of our diocese's patron saint, Saint Joseph the Worker, transferred to Monday, May 2, because May 1 is on Sunday. Pope Pius XII established this feast day in 1955 to Christianize May Day, which in communist countries was supposed to be a holiday for the workers, the proletariat. In 1960, while building the new St. Joseph Cathedral in La Crosse, Bishop John P. Treacy decided it would be appropriate to name the new cathedral after this new feast of Saint Joseph and to observe this as our diocese's patronal feast day because ours is a workingman's diocese. We will have our First Monday Holy Hour before Monday's 5:30 Mass. Please take this opportunity to pray for the needs of the Church in our diocese.

May is a traditional month of devotion to Our Blessed Mother. St. Peter's outdoor Marian statue will be crowned this Sunday morning after the 9:00 Mass, and the indoor Marian statue will be crowned during the 8:30 AM Mass on Friday, May 6. The Marian statue in St. Charles Church will be crowned at the beginning of Mass on Wednesday, May 4. In 1954 Pope Pius XII instituted the feast of the Queenship of Mary on May 31 in his encyclical letter Ad Cæli Reginam.

From the earliest ages of the catholic church a Christian people, whether in time of triumph or more especially in time of crisis, has addressed prayers of petition and hymns of praise and veneration to the Queen of Heaven. And never has that hope wavered which they placed in the Mother of the Divine King. Jesus Christ: nor has that faith ever failed by which we are taught that Mary, the Virgin Mother of God. reigns with a mother's solicitude over the entire world, just as she is crowned in heavenly blessedness with the glory of a Queen.

In the current liturgical calendar this feast was moved to August 22, so that it comes chronologically after the Solemnity of the Assumption. May 31 is now the feast of the Visitation.

In his 1965 encyclical Mense Maio, Pope St. Paul VI said:

May she who experienced the cares and hardships of earthly life, the weariness of daily toil, the hardships and trials of poverty, and the sorrows of Calvary, come to aid the needs of the Church and the human race. May she graciously lend an ear to the devout pleas of those all over the world who beg her for peace. May she enlighten the minds of those who rule nations. And finally, may she prevail on God, who rules the winds and storms, to calm the tempests in men's warring hearts and grant us peace in our day. What we seek is true peace grounded on the sturdy foundations of justice and love—on a justice which recognizes the legitimate rights of the weak as well as those of the strong; on a love which keeps men from falling into error through excessive concern for their own interests. Thus each person's rights may be safeguarded without the rights of others being forgotten or violated.

Those sentiments are just as valid today. The texts of both these encyclicals are available at <w2.vatican.va>.

Pray the rosary this week for good weather for a productive planting and growing season. Pray for the needs of the Church in our diocese and, as always, pray for peace.

May God bless his people with peace.

End of the Year Wrap-up of the Parish Religious Education and Sacramental Programs

Overall, this was a good year for our faith formation efforts. Getting back to a more familiar format and reconnecting with the other parishes in town was a real blessing. Naturally, our enrollment numbers dropped significantly across the board after COVID hit, and while we saw them come back up some this year, they're still not up to our pre-COVID numbers. While we miss the families that we didn't see this year and hope to see them again in the upcoming school year, it did make the merger of the elementary grades of St. Charles/St. Peter and Holy Ghost RE programs quite smooth. We've had a joint program with Holy Ghost, and occasionally Notre Dame parishes, at the middle and high school levels for some years now, but this year we finally joined forces for the elementary program as well, and it's been a wonderful experience.

Our First Reconciliation and First Communion programs are still done by individual parishes. We saw 16 second-graders from St. Charles and 10 from St. Peter make their first confessions and receive their First Holy Communion this year.

The Confirmation program, which was a full city-wide effort again this year, including St. Charles, St. Peter, Holy Ghost, St. Bridget, and Notre Dame, was a joy to be part of. Our goal in combining our efforts is to cultivate a sense of Catholic unity and identity across our city and school systems. Watching the Confirmandi interact with one another through learning, reflection, prayer, scripture, catechism, and teenage goofiness was encouraging for us as leaders, and we hope it was for the kids as well. We will see seven high school sophomores from St. Charles and four from St. Peter will be welcomed into full membership in the Catholic Church on May 8 at 1:00 at St. Charles Borromeo.

It is our conviction that being firmly rooted in our communal and traditional Catholic identity is crucial during these rapidly changing, technological, and increasingly confusing times. As we plan for the upcoming school year, we are looking forward to further pursuing this goal and seeing its fruits.



Hello from the second- to fourth-grade room.

This week in Religion the second graders finished a chapter on the Mass. We read about how Jesus gave us the Mass at the Last Supper. We also learned that the sacrifice of the Mass is the same sacrifice as that of the cross. The second graders are also preparing for their First Holy Communion. The third graders read about Pentecost and Jesus' ascension into heaven. The fourth graders learned about the Trinity and how the love between the Father and the Son is the Holy Spirit.
