### **MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR**

### THE ANNOUNCEMENT OF THE SAVIOR'S BIRTH

Saint Paul, in his letter to the Galatians (4:4), writes: "But when the fullness of time had come, God sent his Son, born of a woman." Only God knew when and how this would happen, although the whole of the Old Testament was a preparation for that event. The ancient announcement of Christ's birth found in the *Roman Martyrology*, proclaimed at the beginning of the

Midnight Mass at St. Peter's in Tilden, focuses both religious and secular history on the birth of Christ. Its text follows.

The twenty-fifth day of December, when ages beyond number had run their course from the creation of the world, when God in the beginning created heaven and earth, and formed man in his own likeness; when century upon century had passed since the Almighty set his bow in the clouds after the Great Flood, as a sign of covenant and peace; in the twenty-first century since Abraham, our father in faith, came out of Ur of the Chaldees; in the thirteenth century since the People of Israel were led by Moses in the Exodus from Egypt; around the thousandth year since David was anointed King; in the sixty-fifth week of the prophecy of Daniel; in the one hundred and ninety-fourth Olympiad; in the year seven hundred and fifty-two since the foundation of the City of Rome; in the forty-second year of the reign of Caesar Octavian Augustus, the whole world being at peace, JESUS CHRIST, eternal God and Son of the eternal Father, desiring to consecrate the world by his most loving presence, was conceived by the Holy Spirit, and when nine months had passed since his conception, was born of the Virgin Mary in Bethlehem of Judah, and was made man: The Nativity of Our Lord Jesus Christ according to the flesh.

(From the Roman Martyrology)

With the angels the Church proclaims the hymn, "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to people of good will." I find the hymns of the Christmas season to be among the most theologically profound of the entire year. They are so full of scriptural references and images. Their melodies, too, evoke the deepest emotions. Enjoy the music of this season and pay attention to the words! They are a catechism on the mystery of the incarnation and of our salvation.

In this season marked by family gatherings, it is appropriate that we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph. When God the Son, the second person of the Blessed Trinity, became incarnate in human flesh, he became a member of a human family and of the human family. God entrusted to the care of Mary and Joseph his divine Son, just as he entrusts to the care of their parents all children born into this world. Since all of us are children of God, parents should receive and nurture their children with the same reverence and love with which Mary and Joseph cared for Jesus. Likewise, children should obey and love their parents as Jesus was obedient to Mary and Joseph. Because there is no Sunday between Christmas and January 1 this year, the Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph is celebrated on Friday, December 30.

Enjoy these holy holidays as you gather with family and friends. Pray for the safety of all who are traveling during these days and remember those who are far from home, especially those serving overseas. Thanks for your generosity to the poor of our community through your donations to local food pantries, volunteering at Agnes Table and Sojourner House, donations to the Spirit of Christmas and Casa Hogar Juan Pablo II, and so much more. Thanks to all who cleaned and decorated our churches, who put up the outdoor decorations and nativity scenes, and who prepared for the Christmas liturgies as ministers and musicians.

On behalf of Father Ethan Hokamp, Deacon Daniel Rider, our parish staff and me, I assure you of our prayers and best wishes for a blessed and joyful Christmas.

May God bless us all this Christmas and always. Monsignor Gorman

It's almost time for Christmas and you can sure tell in first grade. The excitement as they begin thinking about Christmas, Santa, and of course the break that comes with it. Some days it's hard to stay focused. We started working on an advent book as we count down the days to Christmas and the birth of our Savior. The first graders are working on a promise a week to prepare for Jesus' birth. They are finding it is difficult to keep some promises and have to make others more realistic. Next week we will learn the meaning of each candle; hope, peace, joy, love, and talk about times we have felt each one.

In Language arts we have been reading about different types of libraries all over the world. In Egypt we learned about a cat who lived in the library to keep the ancient scrolls safe from rats and bugs. In Norway, a library ship travels to small cities so children read books. We learned that people can build a small library and share books with their neighbors. This past week we read about the library in Fez Morocco that has such old books that you need four keys held by four people to open the doors. We have also been learning about past and present tense verbs.

In Math we are looking at two-digit numbers and finding the tens and ones in them. It really helps when adding those bigger numbers together. In Social Studies, we are digging deeper into patriotism and looking at why we stand for the pledge of allegiance and what it means. In Science, we are looking at sound and seeing how it vibrates. We are learning so much right now that we will need a break in a couple weeks.


