#### **MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR**

# MARY, THE MOTHER OF GOD AND QUEEN OF PEACE

Today, on New Year's Day, we celebrate the second of the three solemnities of the Christmas season: the Solemnity of Mary, the Holy Mother of God. Without Mary's cooperation, God's plan for our salvation could not have come to completion. Saint Paul sums it up in today's Second Reading: "When the fullness of time had come, God sent his Son, born of a woman, born under the law, to ransom those under the law, so that we might

receive adoption as sons." (Galatians 4:4-5) On this day we express our debt of gratitude to Mary, whose response to God was: "Behold I am the handmaid of the Lord; let it be done to me according to your word."

For 56 years now January 1 has been observed by Catholics, at least, as the World Day of Peace. For his message for the 56<sup>th</sup> annual World Day of Peace, Pope Francis has chosen the theme, "No one can be saved alone. Combatting Covid-19 together, embarking together on paths of peace." Reflecting on the world's experience of these past three years, he says:

Certainly, after directly experiencing the fragility of our own lives and the world around us, we can say that the greatest lesson we learned from Covid-19 was the realization that we all need one another. That our greatest and yet most fragile treasure is our shared humanity as brothers and sisters, children of God. And that none of us can be saved alone. Consequently, we urgently need to join together in seeking and promoting the universal values that can guide the growth of this human fraternity. We also learned that the trust we put in progress, technology and the effects of globalization was not only excessive, but turned into an individualistic and idolatrous intoxication, compromising the very promise of justice, harmony and peace that we so ardently sought. In our fast-paced world, the widespread problems of inequality, injustice, poverty and marginalization continue to fuel unrest and conflict, and generate violence and even wars.

The pandemic brought all this to the fore, yet it also had its positive effects. These include a chastened return to humility, a rethinking of certain consumeristic excesses, and a renewed sense of solidarity that has made us more sensitive to the suffering of others and more responsive to their needs. We can also think of the efforts, which in some cases proved truly heroic, made by all those people who worked tirelessly to help everyone emerge from the crisis and its turmoil as best they could.

Then, after reflecting on the lessons that should be learned from this experience, Pope Francis concludes his message with these words:

To all men and women of good will I express my prayerful trust that, as artisans of peace, they may work, day by day, to make this a good year! May Mary Immaculate, Mother of Jesus and Queen of Peace, intercede for us and for the whole world.

I can assure you, from those I visited, that they were very much appreciated.

Enjoy these holy holidays as you gather with family and friends. Pray for the safety of all who are traveling during these days and remember those who are far from home, especially those serving overseas.



A most blessed Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God to you all. Today we

begin our new year reflecting on the motherhood of the Blessed Virgin Mary. What a beautiful foot to start on, in this new year.

It is only after we've begun our celebration of Christ's nativity that we then turn and pay homage to His mother, who played an integral role in the mystery of our salvation. Contemplating Mary's humble yet confident "fiat" ("Thy will be done") never gets old- it's eternally fresh. Where our first mother in flesh, Eve, turned away from the will of God, Mary shows us what an unfettered will looks like- unselfish and obedient to the God who gives all good things. She is trusting where we are suspicious. She is humble where we are self-inflated. Mary is a mother, like so many of you are in this parish. And we honor her for her selfless "yes", a yes every mother gives to God when she brings life into this world. What a privilege it is to be a part of a Faith that sets aside a day to especially honor the role of motherhood. I encourage you all to reflect on Mary in her role as mother of the Christ and spiritual mother to you and me. There are plentiful resources (books, articles, consecrations, music) to enkindle a greater love and understanding of Mary, the Mother of God. I highly recommend Caryll Houselander's The Reed of God as well as Bishop Fulton Sheen's The World's First Love. To any who might fear that focusing on the Blessed Mother takes away from our love and worship of her Son, I quote Bishop Sheen:

"It is on account of Our Divine Lord that Mary receives special attention, and not on account of herself. Left to herself, her motherhood would dissolve into humanity. But when seen in the light of His Divinity, she becomes unique. Our Lord is God Who became Man...it is her Son who makes her Motherhood different...We did not choose Mary; He did."



When something wonderful happens, we want to find out all about it, then go tell everyone we know. That's just what the shepherds did. We also want to think about it again and again. That's just what Mary did. Jesus has come to us. Let's do what the shepherds and Mary did.


