# **Message from the Pastor**

### YOUR LIGHT HAS COME

Today we celebrate the third and final solemnity of the Christmas season, the Epiphany of the Lord. The symbol which characterizes this solemnity is light. It is first of all Christ who is our light. As Word made flesh. he is the fullness of God's revelation of himself to humanity. By the light of faith, through which we have

been enlightened in baptism, we are made capable of

accepting this revelation. It is this light, which draws us to Jesus and enables us to profess our faith in him as the Christ, which is symbolized by the star in today's Gospel.

The Magi in today's Gospel represent the whole of humanity, for God's plan of salvation is universal in scope. The people of the Old Covenant, Israel, understood that all nations would someday acknowledge and worship their God as the one true God, symbolized by those from throughout the known world streaming to Jerusalem. (Cf. First Reading and Responsorial Psalm) This has come to pass in the Christian era, since "the Gentiles are coheirs, members of the same body, and copartners in the

promise in Christ Jesus through the gospel." (Second Reading) Now we are called to bear the light of Christ, in word and deed, into a world still too full of darkness. In Matthew's gospel Jesus says: "You are the light of the world...your light must shine before men so that they may see goodness in your acts and give praise to your heavenly Father." (5:14a, 16)

The liturgical season of Christmas ends this Monday, January 9, with the feast of the Baptism of the Lord. As narrated in the Gospel for the feast, God the Father himself attests that he whose birth we have been celebrating is in fact God the Son become man. This truth was announced by angels to shepherds, signified to the Magi by a star and heralded by John the Baptist.

The incongruity of the sinless Son of God receiving a baptism of repentance was not lost on John the Baptist. When Jesus came to be baptized, John said: "I need to be baptized by you, and yet you are coming to me?" Nevertheless Jesus insists upon it "to fulfill all righteousness." The preface of John the Baptist explains it this way: "To make holy the flowing waters, he baptized the very author of Baptism."

Jesus' baptism was to mark the beginning of his public ministry. The baptism we received is the baptism with the Holy Spirit that John predicted would succeed his baptism of repentance. (Cf. Matthew 3:11 and Luke 3:16) It is through this baptism that we become God's children by adoption, "born not by natural generation nor by human choice nor by a man's decision but of God." (John 1:13) From this flows our ministry as members of the Body of Christ: "Go into the whole world and proclaim the gospel to every creature." (Mark 16:15)

Perhaps you have wondered why you have not heard about the Diocesan Annual Appeal. The Annual Appeal for 2022-2023 has been incorporated into the Inspired by the Spirit Campaign. This comprehensive, all-parish campaign effort began in parishes this past spring and is being conducted throughout this past fall and the first half of 2023. It will not only incorporate and support the various ministries through the Diocesan Annual Appeal, but also provides an opportunity for every parish in the Diocese to raise funds for its own needs, the Holy Cross Diocesan Center, and the new Catholic Foundation of West Central Wisconsin. Our parishes are assigned to the second block of the campaign timeline. You will soon be hearing more details. Please begin to pray about your commitment to this campaign and know that you will be invited to participate in the next few months.

Pray the rosary this week for our Holy Father's intention for this month, which is for educators: "That educators may be credible witnesses. teaching fellowship rather than competition and helping the youngest and most vulnerable above all." The annual Catholic Schools Week occurs later this month, January 29-February 4. Pray also for the repose of the soul of Pope Benedict XVI. Requiescat in pace.

May God bless his people with peace. Monsignor Gorman



Happy New Year from the 6th, 7th, and 8th grade classes! This group of students came back from Christmas Break ready to dive into the new calendar year.

Fifth and sixth grade students are studying the Fifth Commandment: You Shall Not Kill. They are learning that this commandment covers more than the physical killing of another. One who is registered and regularly participates in the liturgical life of the parish and demonstrates support of the parish mission by completing and fulfilling an annual commitment of time, treasure and talent.

**To register in the Parish:** We welcome anyone interested in being an active member of our parish. Please call the parish office (715-723-4088) and make an appointment with Msgr. Michael Gorman.

**Baptisms:** First-time parents must attend an instruction class, which is held every three months. Parents are encouraged to plan ahead and attend the class prior to the birth of their child. Please contact the parish office to sign up for the class.

**Marriages:** Couples are required to contact Father at least six months prior to the anticipated wedding date and BEFORE making any other arrangements or reserving a reception hall.

Anointing of the Sick: If you would like to receive the Sacrament of the Sick, please see Father after Mass. The sacrament is available to all who are ailing physically, mentally or spiritually.

**Hospitalized/Homebound:** If you are in the hospital or homebound and would like to receive Holy Communion, please contact the parish office.


