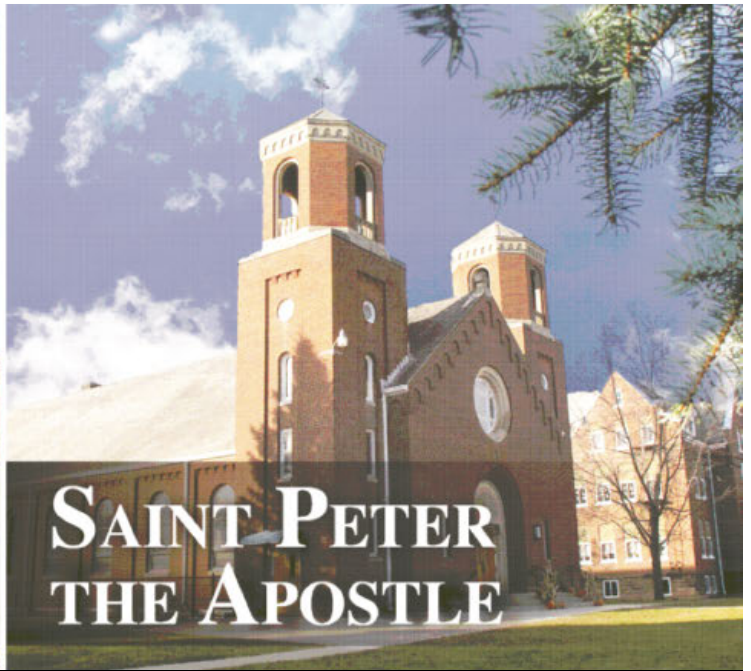

MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

HE IS THE SON OF GOD

We have returned to the liturgical season of Ordinary Time. You will notice that a noble simplicity has returned in the church decorations and the ceremonies of the Mass. This season does not highlight any particular mystery of salvation. Rather, we reflect upon the events of the life and ministry of Jesus as the Gospel of Matthew is proclaimed in more or less continuous fashion from now until the beginning of Lent.

In today's Gospel passage Saint John the Baptist fulfills his destiny as herald of the Messiah when he attests that Jesus "is the Son of God." We remain at the scene of Jesus' baptism, commemorated last Monday. The testimony of the Father, the Holy Spirit and John the Baptist is further interpreted by Isaiah's prophecy about a "servant" who will be "a light to the nations, that [God's] salvation may reach to the ends of the earth." (First Reading) This prophecy continues the Epiphany theme of the universality of God's plan of salvation and the image of light as a symbol of God's self-revelation in Christ. We, as disciples of Jesus and members of the Church, are reminded by Saint Paul that we are "called to be holy" (Second Reading) as we bear the torch of righteousness in our world.

The annual Week of Prayer for Christian Unity begins on Wednesday, January 18, and ends next Wednesday, January 25, the Feast of the Conversion of Saint Paul. This year's theme is inspired by Isaiah 1:12-18, "Do Good; Seek Justice." In these verses the Lord laments a lack of justice among the People of God. Yet he also promises redemption by encouraging acts of justice. Like Isaiah, we hope to inspire a renewed desire and effort for justice among the Christian peoples around the world. Again this year we pray that the scandal of a divided Christendom may be overcome, a stated priority for Pope Francis.

Jerry Boorsma retired for the second time as the Sacred Music Director at St. Charles as of January 2, 2023. He has been succeeded in that position by Abigail Lynch, who currently resides in St. Peter's Rectory. Abigail is a recent graduate of the University of Mary in Bismarck, North Dakota. She has been working with Jerry since coming here this past summer to prepare to assume the responsibilities of the position. Welcome, Abigail.

Vitula "Vi" McMahan, our longtime administrative assistant in the Central Office, passed away this past Tuesday, January 10, in Wausau. Her funeral was celebrated at St. Matthew Parish in Wausau. We will have a memorial Mass at St. Charles at a date yet to be determined. I visited her in the hospital just a week before. She was taking care of her temporal affairs, had made her funeral arrangements, and seemed very much in charge. Whether her time remaining in this world would be long or short, she was very much at peace. She knew that everything was ultimately in God's hands and she had completely entrusted herself to his providential care. May God grant her the reward of her many years of faithful service. *Requiescat in pace.*

Pray the rosary this week for the repose of the soul of Vi McMahan. Pray also for public officials in every branch of government and on every level, especially those who have recently begun terms of office. Prudence, respect and dialogue are necessary for genuine progress and peace. As always, pray for peace.

May God bless his people with peace.

Greetings!

I've been listening to the Catechism in a Year with Fr. Mike Schmitz since the first of the year, and can I just say: wow, this is revitalizing and eye-opening. I don't know what your perception of the Catechism of the Catholic Church is, or if you even have one, but for many years mine was, "Well that's a thick book".

Embarrassing to admit, but for whatever reason it didn't occur to me to take it down from the shelf and see what was going on. I tiptoed into the content a bit when my sister and I were given copies of the *Youcat* (Youth Catechism), and it became a resource for my teenage self's specific questions. But after moving away for college, I never re-approached the book. Perhaps I was under the delusion that I already knew our Catholic faith well enough. Right off the bat, the Catechism hits us with this:

God, infinitely perfect and blessed in himself, in a plan of sheer goodness, freely created man to make him share in his own blessed life. For this reason, at every time and in every place, God draws close to man. He calls man to seek him, to know him, to love him with all his strength. He calls together all men, scattered and divided by sin, into the unity of his family, the Church. To accomplish this, when the fullness of time had come, God sent his Son as Redeemer and Saviour. In his Son and through him, he invites men to become, in the Holy Spirit, his adopted children and thus heirs of his blessed life.

God draws close to man. To you, to me. God, the ineffable and infinitely perfect, desires relationship with you and I. What an incredible reminder at the beginning of a new calendar year. We were created by love, in love, for love. Do not forget this. Do not keep this information from your spouse, children, friends and family. This is the sort of knowledge that saves people and reminds them of their true identity. Not the misplaced identity so many attribute to their accomplishments, social circles and belongings.

I invite you to start the Catechism in the Year, available on Hallow/Spotify/Apples Podcasts etc., and be daily reminded of (or introduced to) the beauty and wisdom of the Church Christ instituted almost 2,000 years ago.

Hello from the grades 3-5 classroom.

We hope you all had a fantastic week! This week in Religion the third graders read about the 6th-10th commandments. We talked about ways that we can keep our bodies pure and how it's not only our bodies we need to respect but the bodies of others, too. The fourth graders read about the first king of Israel, Saul, and his successor David.

In Math, the third graders began a chapter on division. They learned how multiplication and division are related and practiced dividing by 2s, 3s, and 4s. The fourth graders also began a new chapter this week on long division. The fifth graders continued working with fractions and mixed numbers. This week they practiced subtracting them and then renaming them as proper fractions.

In Social Studies, the fifth and sixth graders read about the ancient civilization of the Hebrews. They are finding this unit interesting because it is the same information they learned in their religion classes in regards to the enslavement of the Israelites in Egypt, the plagues, and the exodus. In third- and fourth-grade Wisconsin History, we read about the early explorers to come to our state and the search for furs that brought them here. We also learned about how they were also searching for the Northwest Passage while on their journeys.

Finally, a reminder to all school families: Wednesday, January 18, is our next Home and School Meeting at 6:30 PM in the church basement. Each family should have a representative present.
