MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

BLESSED ARE YOU

Today's Gospel contains the famous passage known as "The Beatitudes." Now "beatitude" is the state of being "blessed"-beatus in Latin. Beatus is the Latin translation of the Greek word μακάριος (makários)-the word used in the original Greek-also meaning "blessed" or "happy." Michael J. Gorman So the teaching in today's Gospel is about happiness.

Looking at some of the beatitudes makes it clear that Jesus is not speaking of happiness from the usual perspective. He calls "blessed" those who are poor in spirit, who mourn, who are persecuted, who are insulted and who are falsely accused. It is not in suffering these injustices that one is blessed, however, but in persevering and triumphing over them rather than returning insult for injury. The triumph, however, may not be realized on earth, but will be rewarded in heaven.

We live in an imperfect world, where suffering and injustice are all too prevalent. Much of this is the result of human sinfulness: willfully perpetrated evil. Some is the consequence of human weakness. See what Saint Paul says in today's Second Reading: "God chose the foolish of the world to shame the wise, and God chose the weak of the world to shame the strong." God is the source of strength and triumph over the world's evils. God himself assures us of this through the Prophet Zephaniah in today's First Reading: "Seek the LORD, all you humble of the earth"; and in today's Responsorial Psalm: "The LORD keeps faith forever, secures justice for the oppressed, gives food to the hungry. The LORD sets captives free. The LORD gives sight to the blind; the LORD raises up those who were bowed down. The LORD loves the just; the LORD protects strangers."

Jesus does not call us to be satisfied with suffering and injustice, but to be willing to do something about it. We may have to endure it ourselves, but we are also called to "hunger and thirst for righteousness" and to "show mercy." The Prophet Zephaniah also tells us to "seek justice." Jesus is the Just One who suffers for the sake of righteousness: "Father, forgive them, they know not what they do." (Luke 23:34) Saint Peter teaches that "whenever anyone bears the pain of unjust suffering because of consciousness of God, that is a grace." (1 Peter 2:19) Using Christ as our example, Saint Peter says: "When he was insulted, he returned no insult; when he suffered, he did not threaten; instead, he handed himself over to the one who judges justly. He himself bore our sins in his body upon the cross, so that, free from sin, we might live for righteousness. By his wounds you have been healed." (1 Peter 2:23-24) In him we are truly blessed.

This weekend is the beginning of Catholic Schools Week. This year's theme is, "Catholic Schools: Faith. Excellence. Service." The focus of Catholic education is our students and their formation in every dimension of their lives, including their faith. Nowhere else, outside the home, can young people receive the emphasis on learning and living the Catholic faith that our Catholic schools provide. No other school system has the freedom to integrate faith into every dimension of school life. Our Catholic schools are a treasure and we have reason to celebrate. May God bless the ministry of Catholic education. Thanks to all of you who provide prayerful and financial support to our Catholic schools.

Pray the Rosary this week for students, parents and teachers, and for all who are a part of our McDonell Area Catholic Schools and St. Peter School in Tilden. As always pray for peace in Ukraine and the safety of military personnel serving abroad.

May God bless his people with peace. Monsignor Gorman

Hello and happy Sunday!
Ever since the Eucharistic Revival
Summit our Diocese held on the 14th of

this month, this statistic has been on my heart: 71% of self-professed Catholics deny the True Presence of Christ in the Eucharist. It's a gutting reality of our day, and one we desperately need to address. In light of this, a mentor of mine shared an article with me this past week that pondered this statistic. It didn't attempt to give an answer, but asked questions that I believe lead us towards a fundamental issue.

We begin with the Eucharist. Do we believe that the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ is *truly* present to us in the Eucharist? The reality is that He is just as present to us every Mass as He was to His disciples almost 2,000 years ago. Even early pagans in a sense admitted this when they accused Christians of cannibalism. But do we, the faithful, believe it's within God's power to change the "what it is" of something while allowing the external qualities (the "accidents" of it, i.e. bread and wine) to remain?

If we struggle to believe that Jesus Christ could be substantially present to us in the Eucharist, perhaps we should ask ourselves: do we believe that Christ Resurrected was *actually* present in the Upper Room? That it was truly Jesus of Nazareth eating alongside his disciples, in His body, revealing the wounds of His crucifixion? It is hard to comprehend, and reasonably so, the reality of His resurrection and glorified body, and even seems impossible— unless it is God incarnate.

That leads us to the question: do we believe God really became incarnate? Have we allowed ourselves to believe that God's love is that big, that deep, that self-sacrificing for us? I know I have grappled with this reality in light of my own struggle to love myself. How could God love us that much? Why would He want to? In our brokenness and insecurities, we put limits on what we believe God can do. We limit Him to what seems likely and understandable for us. But that is not who God is. We do not determine what He can do. Let's self-reflect on all of the above and ask the Holy Spirit for greater faith today— faith in His goodness, His promises, His love for you and for me.


SC Parish Center Construction Update

Happy winter from first grade!

It sure has been a snowy one, but we are still accomplishing a lot despite the snow days. In Language arts, we just finished a series of books on illustrators. We were able to learn how one of our reading books was illustrated by carving a picture into wood and then using ink to press the picture onto paper. We also learned about a boy who has dyslexia and was able to become a famous illustrator because drawing helped him focus at school. Those talents led to a career in drawing. Did you know that Leo Lionni became an illustrator because his grandkids were too rambunctious on a bus ride? Leo told them a story by ripping two dots out of a magazine he had in his bag. Our next series is about paper making. We will be trying that out this week.

In math we are learning how to add bigger numbers through 20 by making one of the numbers into a 10. For instance, 8+5 could be converted to 10+3=13. Once we get the hang of it, it will be very easy to do.

In Social studies, we are finishing up a unit on our government. The boys and girls have learned a little about our founding fathers, the Declaration of Independence, and the Constitution. We will learn more about both in second grade. In Science, we are finishing up a unit on light and sound. We used light and sound to communicate by mores code. It was a lot of fun just spelling our names in mores code.

For Religion, we learned that the Bible is God's word, and that we are to spread it to everyone we meet. God wants all people to be His children, so we can help by telling our friends outside of school how much Jesus loves us. By doing so, we are being messengers of God.


